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

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) is implementing the Balakot Hydropower Project (BHPP) with the financial assistance from Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). The project will (i) improve energy security by increasing the clean energy share in the country's energy mix currently dominated by thermal power generation; (ii) boost the economy and promote revenue generating investments in the hydro-abundant Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province; and (iii) build capacity and awareness on climate change impacts, adaptation and mitigation measures. The project has been divided into two sections for construction purposes; therefore, two (2) separate LARPs (section-wise) were prepared. The 1st Sectional LARP (Mouza Ghanool and Sangar) approved by ADB on dated July 27, 2022¹ and 2nd sectional LARP (Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras) was approved by ADB on dated November 29, 2022².
- 2. As per approved 1st sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Ghanool and Sangar, total acquired land is 848.40 Kanals (106.05 acres) (including 168.2 Kanals of communal land) owned by 1,791 DPs. Other LAR related impacts include (i) 3,045 wood trees, owned by 1,725 DPs and 876 fruit trees, owned by 48 DPs, (ii) 46 residential structures owned by 40 DPs (with only 25 DPs requiring physically relocation), 1 commercial structure and 1 masjid (common prayer place). However, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,791 DPs to 1,874 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, number of owners of trees has also increased from original number (1,773 DPs to 1,862 DPs). Nonetheless, amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. Additionally, a total of 39 DPs is eligible for different admissible allowances in entire 1st sectional LARP.
- 3. As per approved sectional LARP 2 (covering the villages Bela Sacha and Paras), total acquired land is 962.950 Kanals (120.369 acres including 324.52 Kanals of communal land) owned by 1,766 DPs. Similarly other ALR related impacts included the following: (i) a total of 9,189 wood trees owned by 1,457 DPs and 1,448 fruit trees owned by 118 DPs, (ii) 410 structures, owned by 398 DPs (only 196 of which required physical relocation), and 9 communal or public structures including 2 masjids (prayer place), 2 graveyards and 5 government buildings (2 government schools, 1 basic health facility, 1 revenue office and 1 forest office) in villages Bela Sacha and Paras³. However, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,766 DPs to 1,821 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, number of owners of trees has also increased from original number (1,575 DPs to 1,647 DPs). Nonetheless, amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. Additionally, total of 286 DPs is eligible for different admissible allowances in entire 2nd sectional LARP.
- 4. Implementation of LARP is monitored internally by the PIU and externally by an external resettlement monitor (engaged by PIU) as well and Internal and External Monitoring Reports are provided to PIU and shared with ADB. This semi-annual Social Monitoring

Report (SASMR-Internal) the implementation of LARP covering the implementation of both sectional LARPs 1 and 2 progress for the period from July-December 2023. Implementation of sectional LARPs began in August 2022 by the PIU and Land Acquisition Collector (LAC). Mansehra District Officer Revenue. Initially, implementation of sectional LARPs encountered delays due to frequent transfers of relevant officials in the land revenue department. Nonetheless, PIU with support from PMC consultants managed to continue making exhaustive efforts in moving on with the compensation disbursement process while also addressing the compensation cases stuck or impeded due to different administrative and No DPs have been physically displaced by PIU from housing so far. Although, many DPs, left their structures after receiving full compensation from PIU. This has been confirmed by PIU's External Monitoring Agent (EMA) in his last external SASMR of January to June 2023 PIU and PMC continue coordinate with the district revenue department/ LAC office Mansehra to accelerate the disbursement of compensation and allowances to all unpaid DPs. Staff of PIU/ PMC also continue to inform the unpaid DPs through their relatives and Patwaris to come forward and receive their compensation soonest possible. These efforts of PIU and PMC are in accordance with the guidance provided in the ADB's guidance note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments - appended as **Annexure-1**. Sample copies of impediment documents (scanned) are appended as Annexure-2.

5. Status of Implementation: As per approved sectional LARPs (section-1) an amount of PKR 82.11 million (58.15 %) of the total payable land compensation amount PKR 141.19 million has been disbursed to 639 (34.1 %) DPs out of a total of 1,874 DPs (1,791 DPs of approved LARPs and 83 DPs of inheritance mutation) for land of 473.67 kanal (59.21 acres) (55.83 %) out of total 848.40 kanal (106.05 acres) in 2 villages under section-1 of BHP project. Accordingly, for trees compensation, 645 DPs (34.6 %) out of total 1,862 DPs have been received an amount of PKR 17.70 (54.11 %) out of total 32.71 million. Moreover, affected built-up property compensation paid to DPs 40 (100 %) out of total 40 DPs with an amount of PKR 72.52 (97.30 %) out of total PKR 74.53 million in 2 villages under section 1 of BHP Project. Similarly, LAC (revenue department) and PIU supported by PMC is responsible for all types of payments of allowances such as severity, vulnerability, structure relocation, shifting for houses, shifting for commercial structures, transition, business moving assistance, house rent, business allowance for 12 months, electricity and household dislocation (chulla) allowance. As per approved LARP's in the affected two (2) villages of the project, 36 DPs (92.30 %) out of total 39 DPs have been paid for all their admissible allowances including dislocation (chulla) allowance and 15 DPs are paid for their vulnerability allowance amounting PKR 59.376 million (99.683 %) out of total PKR 59.565 million. The 3 unpaid DPs of allowances amounting PKR 0.189 million are undisbursed mainly because of these DPs are out of village while already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will be received their due allowances once they return to the village. As per approved sectional LARPs (section-2) an amount of PKR 188.27 million (44.14 %) of the total payable land compensation amount PKR 426.50 million has been disbursed to 460 (25.3 %) DPs out of a total of 1,821 DPs (1,766 DPs of approved LARPs and 55 DPs of inheritance mutation) for land of 349.19 kanal (43.65 acres) (36.3 %) out of total 962.95

kanal (120.369 acres) in 2 villages under section-2 of BHP project. Accordingly, for trees compensation, 223 DPs (13.54 %) out of total 1,647 DPs have been received an amount of PKR 32.24 (65.66 %) out of total 49.10 million. Moreover, affected built-up property compensation paid to DPs 398 (100 %) out of total 398 DPs with an amount of PKR 1323.315 (92.90 %) out of total PKR 1424.466 million in 2 villages under section 2 of BHP Project. Similarly, LAC (revenue department) and PIU supported by PMC is responsible for all types of payments of allowances such as severity, vulnerability, structure relocation, shifting for houses, shifting for commercial structures, transition, business moving assistance, house rent, business allowance for 12 months, electricity and household dislocation (chulla) allowance. As per approved LARP section 2, in the affected two (2) villages of the project, 204 DPs (71.33 %) out of total 286 DPs have been paid for all their admissible allowances including dislocation (chulla) allowance and 35 DPs are paid for their vulnerability allowance amounting PKR 403.829 million (86.25 %) out of total PKR 468.214 million. The 82 unpaid DPs of allowances amounting PKR 64.385 million are undisbursed mainly because of these DPs are out of village while already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will be received their due allowances once they return to the village. Hence, 240 out of total 325 DPs have been paid, amount of PKR 463.21 million (87.76%) out of total PKR 527.78 million during reporting period in all four villages of the project. Overall status of disbursement of LARP (land and non-land assets compensation and allowances) mouzas/ villages under each section have been given in subsequent chapter-4. A scanned copy of land and non-land assets compensation and allowance voucher (payment receipt) are annexed at Annexure-3 The following summarized Table ES-1 shown the paid and unpaid DPs and compensation amount under each category.

- 6. The field staff of PIU and PMC continued to support the revenue department staff to expedite the disbursement of compensation to the DPs of both sectional LARPs. PIU/PMC collected the field data of both sectional LARPs and prepared the required documentation of the DPs whose compensation payment is unpaid due to legal and administrative impediments. Consultation meetings with DPs and awareness campaigns were launched by PIU/PMC in their efforts to reach out to the DPs. A scanned copy of these efforts is appended as **Annexure-4**.
- 7. The independent valuation study (IVS) of the affected assets have also been carried out by an independent valuation firm. The IVS report of both sectional LARPs have been completed by the valuation firm. The IVS reports are currently being reviewed by ADB and

will be further reviewed by the PIU and the concerned provincial government departments. The results of the valuation reports will be shared with relevant project stakeholders after the reports are cleared from ADB and PIU and the government of KPK.

- The PIU is committed to complete the implementation process of LARP in the entire project affected mouzas. However, on the basis of LARP's implementation progress achieved during the reporting period (July-December 2023), the LARP's implementation status is presented at Table 4.7 in chapter-4 (section wise mouzas highlighted) in gray, green and blue colours where full implementation of LARP is confirmed and already validated by the EMA (External Resettlement Agent of PIU) through the 1st, 2nd and 3rd EMRs respectively. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land is already deposited and secured in district treasury for payment to the unpaid DPs having legal/ administrative impediment as and when they will show-up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/ impediments. The PIU confirms that all DPs other than those unpaid due to legal and administrative impediments have been fully compensated for all LAR impacts and payable allowances in all mouzas under 1st and 2nd sectional LARP as of December 2023. The detail list of paid and unpaid DPs of land, Trees and built-up property of each mouzas were previously provided in SASMR (July-December 2022) for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras is available separately at Annexure-13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, while for mouza Sangar provided in LARP's implementation internal monitoring report (July-October 2022) available at Appendix -1, 2 and 3, and for mouza Ghanool provided in LARP's implementation internal monitoring report (July-October 2022) available at Annexure-5.
- The findings of the internal SASMR of July-December 2023 for both the sectional LARPs 1 and 2 show that from the total 3,695 DPs of all 4 villages, 1,099 DPs have been fully compensated whereas the remaining 2,596 DPs are still unpaid due to different reasons (i.e., legal and administrative impediments) that are beyond PIU's power to address or resolve alone. The details of unpaid 2,596 DPs by types of impediments are as follows: 45 DPs have court cases on internal family disputes; 83 DPs live/work abroad; 268 DPs have inheritance mutation issues; 1,147 DPs continue to remain disinterested in receiving compensation due to meager amount compensation; 4 DPs are juvenile and do not have either national identity card (CNIC) or quardian certificates which PIU and LAC require to address this impediment to the compensation disbursement; 441 DPs live out of city, and 608 DPs out of village. While PIU/PMC continue to reach out the unpaid DPs through different means and continue to make all possible good efforts in addressing all types of impediments to compensation, nonetheless no unpaid DPs have been dislocated so far. The Table ES-3 below resents detailed summary of unpaid DPs (by category of impediment) for cleared understanding the situation. а of

- 10. The institutional set up of PIU has well established safeguards management arrangement with social and environmental management specialists available full time for implementation and internal monitoring of sectional LARPs and EIA and EMP and SSEMPs. Overall, Project Director BHP at PIU is responsible to implement and ensure compliance with social and environmental safeguard requirements of ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) and project specific requirements of social and environment safeguards. PD PIU and the Safeguard Unit is further assisted by the Project Management Consultants (PMC) which have the services of social and environmental specialists made available to PIU under PMC.
- 11. The safeguard unit/team at PIU is headed by Deputy Director Social & Resettlement responsible for implementation of LARP's supported by Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and Patwaris (land record keeper). The BHP Project staff regularly conducted meetings with DC, Mansehra and revenue department staff including Additional Deputy Commissioner, AC, Tehsildar and Patwari (land record keeper) of Tehsil concerned to ensue disbursement of all types of compensation and allowances on fast tracking and disburse the meager compensation amount to the unpaid DPs as soon as possible. The minutes of meeting with DC/ ADC/ revenue official are annexed at the end of this report at **Annexure-5**.
- PIU supported by safeguard unit team and PMC safeguard experts is making continuous efforts to expedite implementation of sectional LARPs. Part of this effort includes dissemination to the DPs through installation and public display banners at public offices such as AC/ Tehsildar office Balakot service delivery center at Balakot, and public places Jamia Masiid's, and notable places in the affected mouzas of the project. Under exhaustive efforts, the PIU provided LARP related information to DPs through public advertisements published in local newspaper and other means of social media informing the DPs about compensation and allowances they can receive from the concerned Tehsildar office of revenue department. A copy of the advertisement and link of social media are annexed at the end of this report at Annexure-6. The additional measures undertaken by the project through an IVS (independent valuation study) to validate replacement rates already communicated to the DPs through Information brochure of LARP in Urdu (local) language among the DPs in all the affected mouzas of the project. The process of dissemination of information brochures is going on till the complete payment of compensation and allowances in the affected mouzas. A scanned copy of information brochure of LARP's in Urdu/ local language available as an annexed at the end of this report at Annexure-7.
- 13. In order to facilitate and expedite disbursement of allowance (payable to DPs as per sectional LARPs), an "Allowance Disbursement Committee" has been constituted under the Chairmanship of Additional Deputy Commissioner (general) Mansehra along with Deputy Director Social and Resettlement of PIU, supported by PMC. The committee members examine every single case of allowance with assistance of PIU/ PMC field staff in order to ascertain and cross verify the required information for considering any DPs for a particular allowance. The LAC/ PIU staff, after completing all the verifications, prepare/sign the payment vouchers for eligible DPs. The notification of the LARP's committee for allowances is annexed at the end of report at **Annexure-8**.

- 14. The project's GRM is fully operational. The village level Grievance Redress Committees (GRCs) for Ghanool and Sangar were established and made fully functional on 15 September 2022 under sectional LARP 1 whereas GRCs for Bela Sacha and Paras were established under sectional LARP 2 on 26 September 2022 and on 12 January 2023, respectively.
- 15. All GRCs in all 4 villages are fully functional and several meetings have been held during the reporting period, however it was decided by the GRC members that meeting will be held on need basis for smooth implementation of project activities and best interest of complainants as well. The notifications of GRC committees are annexed at the end of this report at **Annexure-9**. All DPs and local community of 4 villages have been fully informed about the GRM and GRCs available to them through community consultation meetings as well as through LARP's information brochure dissemination. DPs have been informed about how they can access GRM/GRCs and file any concerns or grievances with the Contractors working on the sites and PIU and PMC.
- 16. During field visits to GRCs in all 4 villages (completed in March 20-23), PIU/ PMC staff conducted additional consultations with members of GRCs on the issue of "Chulah Allowance". The GRC of Mouza Paras initially identified 279 DPs for Chulla allowance, which after thorough scrutiny by PIU and PMC and clarifications, reduced to only 124 cases by the demands of the GRC committee. Similarly, in Mouza Bela Sacha, DPs initially identified as 29 but came down to only 18 by the GRC committee, whereas in the Mouza of Sangar, the DPs is recorded as 10. The discussion/ meetings are still ongoing which will be finalized on provision of the information by DPs for their eligibility by PIU, GRC and PMC on the actual number of DPs eligible for Chulla allowance in accordance with criteria in approved LARPs in different Mouzas and once finalized will be shared in the upcoming report.
- 17. During the reporting period of July-December 2023, eight (8) complaints received by PIU from the affected communities, while total 39 complaints (i.e., 2 complaints regarding pending labour wages, 26 complaints related to demands for additional/ missing monetary allowances, 10 complaints related to internal family dispute on LARP's allowances and 1 complaint regarding partial assessment of built-up property) received from the community till December 2023. As of now, 38 out of 39 complaints have been resolved so far and there is only one (1) pending complaint unresolved. The one (1) unresolved complaint which is related to inclusion of missing/ additional DPs for household dislocation/ Chula allowance. The Project Director PIU of BHPP responded in the meeting held on December 7, 2023, at PIU, through a detail discussion and reply addressing all their grievances related to other monetary allowances. The minutes of GRC's meeting is annexed at the end of the report at **Annexure-10**.
- 18. The sectional LARPs have provision for employment of local laborers and DPs. PIU continued to follow up with contractors for providing job opportunities to the locals and DPs. The PIU has strongly intimated to the contractor to provide job opportunities to the affected community on priority basis either skill or unskilled. The contractors maintained a list of skill and unskilled employed person on monthly basis and the Deputy Director Social and Resettlement of PIU is responsible for monitoring and verification of these list of the affected

community (locals). The affected community are aware about the job opportunities through community meetings and meetings with local administration at tehsil and district level. The contractor has submitted a monthly progress report including data/ information of employed persons locally/ affected community. Similarly, the Deputy Director social and resettlement of PIU regularly monitored the locally employed persons with the contractors. As per the contractors record the project contractors and consultants have employed a total of 660 persons as short-term employment (skilled and un-skilled labor) of which 63.2 % (417 of the total 660) work force has been employed from project area. All of the 417 persons are local work force employed from the affected mouzas of the project. Hiring of skilled and unskilled labours from local project area is monitored by PIU on every month through the monthly progress report of contractors. A list of skilled and unskilled employed persons by the contractors during the reporting period available as an annexed at **Annexure-11**. Similarly, long-term project-based employment which is related to output-4 of the project including, relevant training facilitation support under the livelihood restoration plan (LRP) will be provided i.e., Training on agriculture production, livestock rearing, beekeeping, fish farming and linkages with micro-finance institution, to the DPs or as per the local requirements particularly unemployed youths covering both men and women for relevant skill improvement/ capacity building to reduce impact on their livelihood during project implementation. All such training linked and included in draft LRP of BHP project which will be finalized and conducted by an NGO. The consultants NGO has been mobilized since September 7, 2023. The draft LRP will be finalized by consultant NGO and will be shared with all stakeholders before implementation by NGO. The selected NGO will provide realistic date for updating of LRP after mobilization. The delayed mobilization of NGO due to submission of technical and financial evaluation were not submitted on due dates which ultimately delayed the mobilization of NGO.

19. The LARP's implementation is also externally monitored through engagement of an EMA by PIU. The EMA has been mobilized since June 9, 2022, and submitted semi-annual social external monitoring reports to PIU/ ADB regularly. On validation of EMA under 1st sectional LARP's, the 1st and 2nd SASMR (external by EMA) for mouza Ghanool and Sangar (separately) was approved by ADB on dated December 23, 2022 and December 27, 2022 respectively, while under 2nd sectional LARP's the 3rd SASMR (external by EMA) for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras was approved by ADB on dated March 7, 2023. The latest 4th SASMR (external) was submitted to ADB on dated December 16, 2023 and is under review by

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project Background

- 1. The Islamic Republic of Pakistan has received a loan for "Balakot Hydropower Development Project", from Asian Development Bank (ADB) loan No. 4057 PAK and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) loan No. 8397 with the cost of US\$ 665 Million including counterpart fund of US\$ 115 Million for entire BHP project. The project is executed by Energy and Power Department, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and implementing by Pakhtunkhwa Energy Development Organization (PEDO) through Project Implementation Unit (PIU). This is semi-annual social monitoring report (internal) on LARP's implementation for the period from July-December 2023 of BHP Project.
- 2. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Energy and Power Department (KPEPD) is the executing agency (EA) and Pakhtunkhwa Energy Development Organization (PEDO) is the implementing agency (IA). The project implementation unit (PIU) was established in May, 2019 at PEDO office, Peshawar to manage all the project activities associated with LARP. The PIU is headed by a Project Director responsible for execution and implementation of LARP and also to ensure the availability of funds for LARP's implementation. The Project Director PIU, with the assistance of Deputy Director Social & Resettlement, Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and other staff is responsible for the timely updating, implementation and monitoring of LAR activities.
- 3. BHP Project is classified as category "A" because the involuntary resettlement impact of ADB supported project are considered significant as more than 200 persons are experiencing major impact i.e., losing 10 % or more of their productive assets or physically relocating.

1.2 Project Objectives

- 4. The Balakot Hydropower Project aims to develop a 300 MW run-of-river hydropower scheme on the Kunhar River in Kaghan Valley, between Balakot and Kaghan, Manshera District of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan. The project is aligned with the carbon footprint reduced, and energy sector made more renewable, efficient and reliable. The Project has the following major objectives to achieve:
 - Climate-resilient hydropower plant commissioned: A 300 MW hydropower plant will be commissioned near Balakot City in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province;
 - Capacity for climate change risk management in hydropower production enhanced: Awareness will be developed among the communities with specific training for women and youth groups to serve as climate change leaders;
 - Pakhtunkhwa Energy Development Organization's revenues from indigenous resources increased. PEDO will supply one-third of the electricity generated from the 300 MW hydropower plant to the Peshawar Electricity Supply Company and the rest to the National Transmission Dispatch Company Limited;
 - Income-earning opportunities and skills for local communities increased. During
 construction, the local population will benefit from job opportunities, commercial
 activities, and material supply. The project will generate more than 1,200 skilled and
 unskilled jobs for male and female workers, of which about 40% will be sourced locally.

1.3 Project LARP's Description

5. Resettlement Monitoring and Evaluation is an integral part of the social safeguard requirements (Involuntary Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples), including the land acquisition and resettlement (LAR) process covering the preparation, implementation and monitoring of Land Acquisition & Resettlement Plans (LARP). This is a requirement under ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement 2009 (SPS) and the corresponding loan and project agreements. The BHP project has been divided into two sections for construction purpose; therefore, two (2) separate LARPs (section-wise) were prepared for the entire project. The 1st sectional LARP⁴ (mouza Ghanool and Sangar) and 2nd sectional LARP⁵ (mouza Bela Sacha and Paras) was approved by ADB on dated July 27, 2022 and November 29, 2022 respectively. Therefore, this LARP's semi-annual social monitoring report (internal) prepared for both sections and all affected mouzas under 1st and 2nd sectional LARP's. More information of the project sections, component of BHPP, mouza, acquired land affected (only) and number of DPs has been summarized below in **Table** 1.1.

1.3.1 Section-1: Mouza Ghanool and Sangar (under 1st Sectional LARP)

1.3.1.1 Mouza Ghanool

6. Based on approved 1st sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises of Surge Shaft and access road to Surge Shaft in Mouza Ghanool. A land of 30.95 kanal (3.87 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned Dam component/ infrastructure of under section-1. As per LARP's implementation in mouza Ghanool under paid land of 21.36 Kanal (2.67 acres) (69.01 %), comprising maximum 2.91 kanal (0.363 acres) (13.62 %), minimum 0.03 kanal (0.00375 acres) (0.14 %), and average 0.218 kanal (0.2727 acres) (1.02 %) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 9.59 Kanal (1.20 acres) (30.99 %), comprising maximum 2.93 kanal (0.366 acres) (30.55 %), minimum 0.023 kanal (0.0028 acres) (0.24 %), and average 0.15 kanal (0.019 acres) (1.56 %) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. 1.3.1.2 Mouza Sangar

7. Similarly, as per approved 1st sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises of Access Tunnel to Cavern Powerhouse, access roads, tailrace, staff colony and switch yard in mouza Sangar. A land of 817.45 kanal (102.18 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned Dam component/ infrastructure in mouza Sangar under section-1. As per LARP's implementation in mouza Sangar under paid land of 452.31 kanal (56.54 acres) (55.33 %), comprising maximum 24.30 kanal (3.04 acres) (5.37 %), minimum 0.00033 kanal (0.0000413 acres) (0.000073 %), and average 0.974 kanal (0.122 acres) (0.022 %) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 365.14 Kanal (45.64 acres) (44.67 %), comprising maximum 14.36 kanal (1.795 acres) (3.93 %), minimum 0.0019 kanal (0.000238 acres) (0.00052 %), and average 0.189 kanal (0.023 acres) (0.052 %) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP's implementation and as per revenue record no DPs identified as squatter or unregistered user of the affected land plots. Location map of mouza Sangar (section-1) at **Figure** 1.1.

1.3.2 Section-2: Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras (under 2nd Sectional LARP)


1.3.2.1 Mouza Bela Sacha

8. Based on approved 2nd sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises of Dam Right Side Abutment, Reservoir, Diversion/ Sediment By-Pass Tunnel and Access Road to Diversion/ Sediment by Pass Tunnel in mouza Bela Sacha. A land of 175.575 kanal (21.947 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned Dam component/ infrastructure in mouza Bela Sacha under section-2. As per LARP's implementation in mouza Bela Sacha under paid land of 123.41 kanal (15.43 acres) (70.3 %), comprising maximum 12.87 kanal (1.61 acres) (11.73 %), minimum 0.02 kanal (0.0025 acres) (0.018 %), and average 1.14 kanal (0.14 acres) (1.03 %) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 52.17 Kanal (6.52 acres) (29.7 %), comprising maximum 11.37 kanal (1.42 acres) (17.3 %), minimum 0.001 kanal (0.000125 acres) (0.00151 %), and average 0.88 kanal (0.11 acres) (1.33 %) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP's implementation and as per revenue record no DPs identified as squatter or unregistered user under the affected land plots. Location map of mouza Bela Sacha (section-2) at **Figure** 1.2.

1.3.2.2 Mouza Paras

9. Similarly, based on approved 2nd sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises of Dam Left Side Abutment, Reservoir, Intake of Headrace Tunnel and Access Road to Dam Crest in mouza Paras. A land of 787.375 kanal (98.422 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned Dam component/ infrastructure in mouza Paras under section-2. As per LARP's implementation in mouza Paras under paid land of 225.78 kanal (28.22 acres) (28.68 %), comprising maximum 6.05 kanal (0.76 acres) (2.68 %), minimum 0.0020 kanal (0.00025 acres) (0.000886 %), and average 0.536 kanal (0.067 acres) (0.237 %) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 561.595 Kanal (70.199 acres) (71.32 %), comprising maximum 10.86 kanal (1.36 acres) (1.93 %), minimum 0.0010 kanal (0.000125 acres) (0.000178 %), and average 0.258 kanal (0.0322 acres) (0.046 %) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP's implementation and as per revenue record no DPs identified as squatter or unregistered user of the affected land plots. Location map of (section-2) **Figure** mouza **Paras** at 1.2.

2 INTERNAL MONITORING REPORT OF LARP IMPLEMENTATION

2.1 Internal Monitoring Requirements of LARPs

10. The LARP implementation is internally monitored by the safeguard's unit in PIU and an External Monitor is engaged to review and validate the monitoring progress and deliver external monitoring reports. Internal monitoring is conducted on semi-annual basis and this LARP implementation internal monitoring report for the period from 1st July to 31st December 2023 of BHP project covers both sectional LARPs. Implementation of sectional LARPs began in August 2022 by the PIU and Land Acquisition Collector (LAC), Mansehra District Revenue Office. Initially, implementation of sectional LARPs encountered delays due to frequent transfers of relevant officials in the land revenue department, Nonetheless, PIU with support from PMC consultants managed to continue making exhaustive efforts in moving on with the compensation disbursement process while also addressing the compensation cases stuck or impeded due to different administrative and legal reasons. No DPs have been physically displaced by PIU from housing so far. Although, many DPs, left their structures after receiving full compensation from PIU. This has been confirmed by PIU's External Monitoring Agent (EMA) in his last external SASMR of January to June 2023. However, the compensation has been disbursed accordingly and the land and non-land affected owners compensated as per provisions of the approved LARPs. In this LARP's and social safeguards compliance semi-annual social monitoring report (internal) July-December 2023. showing status of full implementation of LARP in all mouzas which is already validated by EMA through his 1st, 2nd and 3rd EMRs. The latest 4th SASMR (external) was submitted to ADB on dated December 16, 2023 and is under review by ADB.

2.2 Objectives of the Internal Monitoring Report

- 11. This internal monitoring report presents the safeguards management progress achieved, coordination and consultations efforts carried out to mobilize and assist the DPs for receiving payment of compensation and redress their grievances. It summarizes the progress on following aspects:
 - Delivery of compensation for assets and entitled allowances.
 - Collection of DPs data and preparation of LAR record.
 - LAR issues and progress.
 - Activities and actions for the compensation of payment to the DPs with which efforts were implemented by recording additional documentation as required under ADB's SPS 2009 guidance notes of handling of compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments.
 - Community consultation and information dissemination activities performed for compensation disbursement.
 - Updates on recording, and handling of grievances; and
 - Employment (skilled/ un-skilled) data of DPs and local community who got opportunity in the construction work.

 Any scope changes, design changes, new and unanticipated LAR impacts and damages, if any.

2.3 Monitoring Indicators

- 12. Specific monitoring benchmarks are based on the approved LARP and cover the following:
 - Mouza/ (village) wise disbursement of compensation and status of land acquisition in all affected Mouzas of BHP project;
 - Information campaign and consultation with DPs;
 - Status of land acquisition and payments on land compensation;
 - Status of trees and structures compensation;
 - Status of payment for all admissible allowances;
 - Income restoration activities; and
 - Ensure gender mitigation measures (complaints/ grievances) in the LARP are adhered during bi-annual internal monitoring and reporting process.
 - Employment opportunities.

3 INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT AT PIU FOR BHPP PROJECT

3.1 LARP's Implementation and Monitoring Set-up

13. The safeguards management set-up placed in the PIU is responsible entity for timely and smooth implementation of LARP for BHPP. Under supervision of the Project Director, PIU staff kept a close liaison with the LAC, district land revenue offices and the DPs to facilitate them in processing of compensation claims and deliver compensation of the displaced person. The safeguards set-up of PIU headed by Project Director including Deputy Director Social & Resettlement, Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and Patwaris (land record keepers) revenue. In addition, the Land Acquisition Collector/ DC Mansehra from District Land Revenue Department with land revenue staff is supporting PIU/ PMC in land acquisition and payment of awarded compensation under LAA 1894.

3.2 Project Steering Committee

14. The Project Steering Committee comprises under the Chairmanship of Additional Chief Secretary, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Deputy Commissioner Mansehra. During reporting period no PSC meeting have been conducted as PSC meeting conducted on need bases. However, DC Mansehra, directed the revenue staff to ensure disbursement of land compensation and allowances on fast tracking to the unpaid DPs.

3.3 Disbursement of Allowances by LAC/ PIU

15. The LAC and PIU is responsible for payments of allowances such as severity, vulnerability, shifting allowance for house/ commercial, transition, house rent, business, electricity, structure relocation, household dislocation allowances and business moving assistance. For this purpose, an allowances disbursement committee (notification annexed at **Annexure-8**) has been constituted at the office of LAC/ DC under the chairmanship of Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) along with Deputy Director Social & Resettlement and Assistant Resettlement Expert of PMC. The committee members keenly examine every single case with assistance of PIU staff in order to ascertain required information for considering any individual for a particular allowance. The LAC/ PIU staff after completing all the verifications out in the field, submit its report to the committee and then the vouchers are accordingly signed. As soon as the committee completes its review and signed the cases, cheques are issued to the eligible DPs. (The photographs of different activities annexed at **Annexure-12**).

3.4 Independent Valuation Study (IVS)

16. The IVS consultant mobilized since December 2022. During the reporting period, the IVS consultant has been submitted the assessment reports of both sectional LARPs to ADB on dated December 4, 2023 and is under review by ADB. However, all the DPs of affected mouzas already informed through Information brochure of LARP in Urdu language and consultation meeting. The IVS and LARP's implementation in the form of compensation payment assessed by the revenue department will run parallel towards the commencement

of civil work and full implementation of LARP will be reached after IVS verification to cover any gaps if any to be fulfilled.

4 LARP IMPLEMENTATION PROGRESS REVIEW

4.1 LARP Implementation Progress in reporting period

17. As per approved LARPs, the compensation and admissible allowances for land and above land assets awarded under LAA 1894 was deposited in district treasury at disposal of land acquisition collector (LAC) assigned by the Land Revenue Department in the District Mansehra for completing land acquisition process and disbursement of awarded compensation and allowances. Disbursement of land and non-land compensation awarded under law commenced on August 2, 2022 for 1st sectional LARP and on August 23, 2022 for 2nd sectional LARP by the land acquisition collector in district revenue department. Similarly, all the admissible allowance mentioned below are also paid by LAC/ PIU supported by PMC. The field staff of PIU and PMC thoroughly supported the revenue department staff to expedite the disbursement of compensation and allowances to the DPs. The process of receiving compensation from the revenue department/ ADC at district Mansehra, as per procedure DPs visited the ADC revenue office for receiving compensation. The concerned Tehsildar prepare voucher for the DPs for all his/ her due compensation of affected land and non-land assets from the respective acquaintance rolls. The same voucher forwarded to the DC office for signing and approval and after signing the voucher handover to the DPs for submission in the district account office. The district account office then prepares a Cheque on account of respective DPs. Similarly, DPs then directly submitted his/ her Cheque in the respective bank account for onward clearness/ receiving the desire amount. However, most of the DPs received their compensation combined (including losses of land, trees and structures) while for allowances again visited to revenue department office to receive admissible allowances separately. For reference see voucher No. 705 and 513 annexed at Annexure-3. The field data of the unpaid DPs of all mouzas under section-1 & 2 are collected by PIU/ PMC field staff and prepared all the requisite legal and administrative impediments of unpaid DPs.

4.2 Section and Mouza wise LARP's Implementation and Handing over of Sites

18. The PIU, in consultation with ADB project team adopted section and mouza wise LARP implementation approach to facilitate handing over of sections/ mouza for construction where implementation of LARP is completed and validated by the External Monitor in parallel with implementation of LARP in other sections/ mouza. Accordingly, resources were focused to complete disbursement of compensation and documented all unpaid DPs having impediments to confirm implementation of LARP. All four (4) mouzas under section-1 & 2 have been cleared and handed over to the contractor on validation of EMA, under 1st sectional LARP's, the 1st and 2nd external monitoring report (EMR) for mouza Ghanool and Sangar (separately) was approved by ADB on dated December 23, 2022 and December 27, 2022 respectively, while under 2nd sectional LARP's the 3rd external monitoring report (EMR) for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras was approved by ADB on dated March 7, 2023. The latest 4th EMR has been submitted to ADB on dated December 16, 2023 and is under review by ADB.

19. The PIU and PMC staff during reporting period (July-December 2023), conducted continuous exhaustive efforts accomplished through the utilization of all sources to inform and mobilize all the unpaid DPs in the affected mouzas/ villages, to get compensation and allowances of their acquired land, affected trees and resolve their issues related to land or non-land. The overall detail of disbursement of compensation and allowances of each sectional LARPs during reporting period are presented as under.

4.3 Overall Summary of LARP Implementation in all Sections and Mouzas

20. Under the land award of section-11 of LAA 1894, acquaintance roll (DPs land/ trees/ built-up property compensation payment book) has been prepared for the entire affected land and non-land assets of each mouzas separately under section-1 & 2 by the LAC of land revenue department of district Mansehra. According to "land award" a total of 1811.35 kanals (226,419 acres) of land (including 492,72 kanal (61,59 acres) communal land (The revenue department of Mansehra District, is working on the assessment/ compilation of communal land DPs and once it is completed, then the detail will be incorporated in the upcoming report. As per approved LARP under section 1, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,791 DPs to 1,874 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, number of owners of trees has also increased from original number (1,773 DPs to 1,862 DPs). Nonetheless, amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. As per approved LARP under section 2, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,766 DPs to 1,821 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, number of owners of trees has also increased from original number (1,575 DPs to 1,647 DPs). Nonetheless, amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. All the "awarded amount" compensation of land, trees, built-up property and all the requisite amount for admissible allowances has been deposited in the district treasury department of District Mansehra by the Pakhtunkhwa Energy Development Organization (PEDO). The tables 4.1 and 4.2 below indicates that during reporting period from July-December 2023, an amount of PKR 270.39 million (47.63 %) of total amount of land compensation payable PKR 567.69 million has been disbursed to 1099 (29.74 %) out of total 3,695 DPs for acquired land of 822.86 kanal (102.86 acres) (45.43 %) out of total 1,811.35 kanal (226.42 acres) in all (4) mouza (under section-1 & 2) of BHP project. Similarly, 868 (24.74 %) out of total 3,509 DPs of trees affected have been received an amount of PKR 49.94 (61.04 %) out of total PKR 81.81 million of trees compensation. However, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (3,557 DPs to 3,695 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, number of owners of trees has also increased from original number (3.348 DPs to 3.509 DPs) in all four (4) villages of BHP project. Nonetheless, amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. Moreover, affected built-up property compensation paid to DPs 438 (100 %) out of total 438 DPs with an amount of PKR 1395.838 (93.12 %) out of total PKR 1498.999 million in entire affected mouzas of BHP Project. Additionally, there is no new DPs eligible for vulnerability allowance amongst the additional DPs. Based on the available additional DPs due to inheritance mutation there is no vulnerable DPs found after the assessment of their income analysis/ investigation. For comparative analysis, section and mouza wise summary of compensation, disbursement for LAR impacts, (land, trees and built-up property)

and progress of payments achieved during reporting period (January-June 2023) are presented in the below **Table** 4.1, Table 4.2, **Table** 4.3 &Table 4.4.

4.3.1 Disbursement of Trees Compensation

21. In the reporting period (July-December 2023), an amount of PKR 49.94 (61.04 %) out of total 81.81 million compensation amount of fruit and non-fruit trees has been disbursed to 868 (24.74 %) out of total 3,509 DPs in entire four (4) mouzas of the Project. It is pertinent to mentioned that as per approved LARPs that 3,182 DPs of timber trees and 166 DPs of fruit trees affected while added 156 DPs of timber trees and 5 DPs of fruit trees affected respectively due to inheritance mutation. The slow progress of trees compensation amount disbursement is due to non-availability of the DPs to receive trees compensation amount. The undisbursed compensation amount is secured in the district treasury account to ensure payment as and when they will show-up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues. The section and mouza wise detail of awarded fruit and non-fruit trees compensation amount, no. of DPs, progress of disbursement and its percentage is presented below in **Table 4**.3.

4.3.2 Disbursement of Built-up Property Compensation

22. During the reporting period (July-December 2023), an amount of PKR 1395.838 (93.12 %) out of total 1498.999 million compensation amount of built-up property has been disbursed to 438 (100 %) out of total 438 DPs in entire mouzas of BHP Project. All DPs of built-up property have been paid only communal and public built-up property amount is undisbursed. The undisbursed compensation amount of communal private and public builtup property is secured in the district treasury account to ensure payment as and when unpaid DPs/ public department will show-up with valid claim documents after completing the required documentation. As per LARPs total of 197 graves (19 in mouza sangar and 178 graves in mouza Paras) are affected due to project. The PIU has transferred all the requisite amount regarding graves management in the district treasury of district Mansehra. During reporting period, the DC Mansehra, has been formed a committee for the shifting of graves of the affected communities. Similarly, as per award notification under section-11 of LAA 1894 and physical verification by PIU and PMC no other Masjid is existed in the mouza of Sangar. The section and mouza wise category of built-up properties awarded built-up compensation amount, no. of DPs, progress of disbursement and its percentage is presented below in **Table** 4.4.

4.3.2.1 Restoration of Built-up Property

23. According to the DPs of affected built-up property, that they will restore/ reconstruct by their own choice or in another parcel of their own land through the received compensation amount along with other admissible allowances of their affected structures and also reused the affected structure salvaged building materials. Furthermore, the project has impact on the built-up properties (public and community structures). However, the negotiation of PIU is continued with the respective government department and district administration of Mansehra and local community for the relocation of the structures.

4.3.3 Pending Payment of Land Compensation

24. The findings of the LARPs implementation semi-annual social monitoring report (internal) revealed that left-over land payments are impeded due to the following legal and administrative impediments for which required additional documents are recorded following templates provided in the ADB's guidance notes annexed at **Annexure-1**, on handling of compensation cases having legal and administrative impediments. The staff of PIU/ PMC also continue to inform the unpaid DPs through their relatives and Patwaris to come forward and receive their compensation soonest possible. These efforts of PIU and PMC are in accordance with the guidance provided in the ADB's guidance note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments. In the previously reported period (Jan-June 2023) total of 2,833 unpaid DPs of land compensation were pended/ impeded while during the current reporting quarters (July-Dec 2023) the unpaid number of DPs decreased as 2,596 of land compensation are impeded due to various reasons. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land and non-land is already deposited and secured in district treasury for payment to the unpaid DPs having legal/ administrative

impediment, as and when they will show-up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/ impediments. The additional documents recorded for unpaid DPs having impediments in all four (4) mouzas of the project. A scanned sample copies of impeded cases are added at the end of report as **Annexure-2**.

- i. Stay Order by Civil Court: The land owners/ DPs (45 DPs having PKR 7.02 million amounts identified so far) have filed their reference and title disputes in the courts that have not been resolved yet. The compensation amount could not be paid to them until land compensation and/ title issues are resolved/ decided by the competent revenue authorities/ courts. Summary of unpaid litigating number of DPs in each mouza under section-1 and 2 is presented in below Table 4.5.
- ii. **DPs working Abroad:** As per LAA 1894, DPs have to submit their claims supported with valid title documents and receive compensation voucher/ cheque in person after due verification of their documents and record. The staff of PIU regularly contacted their relatives to pursue them for advising the DPs to come and get the compensation or nominating his attorney by issuing a valid power of attorney to collect awarded compensation amount on behalf of the unpaid DP. Currently, total of 83 DPs (No co-owner existed) having land compensation amount PKR 14.06 million are identified who have been working abroad. These DPs will be paid either if they show up personally, or provide a valid power of attorney. The unpaid number of DPs of each affected mouzas living/ working abroad is presented in below **Table** 4.5.
- iii. Inheritance Mutation Issues: The land owners (268 DPs amounting PKR 36.47 million so far identified) have passed away which requires mutation of land to the legal heirs. Payments of compensation to legal heirs will be made after mutation of land is affected by the district revenue authority. For this purpose, PIU staff thoroughly supporting the revenue staff and mobilizing known legal heirs to speed up the mutation process for DPs. After inheritance mutation in land record, all heirs of deceased DPs will receive entitled compensation as per their inherited share. However, the cases of DPs with pending mutation have been documented for all mouzas of project following the Guidance Note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments of ADB annexed at Annexure-1. Inheritance mutation number of DPs of each mouzas is presented in below Table 4.5.
- iv. Awarded Meager⁷ Compensation Amount: A total of 1,147 unpaid DPs are entitled to awarded compensation amount less than PKR 5000. Total sum of meager compensation amount is PKR 1.49 million that have not yet been disbursed because DPs are not inclined to get valid title documents and submit claims. As procedural requirement, DPs have to get the land title documents from land record office, open bank account and appear in person before the LAC and District Accounts Office for verification and receive compensation vouchers and cheques.

No mechanism available to make cash compensation to DPs in the revenue department/ LAC at district Mansehra. Due to cumbersome procedural requirements for receiving such a small amount of compensation, DPs are reluctant to open bank account as the amount required for opening of bank account is much more than the entitled compensation amount. The unpaid meager compensation amount of land, and total number of unpaid DPs of meager amount of each mouzas is presented in below **Table** 4.5.

- v. **DPs Juvenile (under the age of 18):** Currently a total of 4 DPs having compensation amount PKR 0.007 million are juvenile and lack Computerized National Identity Card (CNIC) (so far) in all mouzas of the project. Such Juvenile DPs can be paid either through their guardian, provided guardianship certificate issued by a competent court is produced or when the juvenile DPs gets his CNIC after becoming 18 years old. Accordingly, statements of natural guardians will be documented in accordance with given template in ADB's guidance note. The unpaid juvenile DPs of each mouzas is presented in **Table** 4. 5below.
- vi. DPs having Communal Land: As per revenue record and LAR implementation shows that 492.72 kanal of communal land amounting PKR 67.45 million are unpaid due to communal/ joint compensation amount and not viable to disburse among all the DPs. Under the record of revenue department, the total DPs are not yet identified and the disbursement of compensation is possible until the exact number of DPs under this category is identified/ communicated by the revenue department. Therefore, as and when they all are available then all the compensation amount will be disbursed accordingly. Hence, it will take time to disburse as and when all the DPs are identified and are available to receive their due compensation amount from the revenue department. Therefore, the only procedure is the availability of the DPs and then all the compensation will be disbursed accordingly. Additionally, the revenue department working on the separate acquaintance roll for such DPs against communal land but not yet finalized. Also, the DPs of communal land having some internal family dispute and filled reference/ stay order from civil court against each other. The timeline is depending upon the availability of DPs and resolving of their internal family dispute against each other.
- vii. **DPs Out of City:** As per available revenue record 441 DPs identified having land compensation amount PKR 121.24 million have been migrated/ out of city in Pakistan for better work opportunities. Even though they all were informed by their relatives regarding compensation to collect due compensation amount but neither they are showing up in person nor nominating attorneys for collecting compensation on their behalf. Out of city unpaid DPs are documented and their record maintained as per ADB guidance note and a summary of all mouzas shown in below **Table** 4.5.
- viii. **DPs Out of Village:** As per revenue record, 608 DPs identified having land compensation amount PKR 49.56 million in all affected mouzas of the project, who

were neither known by their respective mouza inhabitants and revenue staff nor their where about are known, so these DPs and their current places of residence are not known. The out of village unpaid DPs of all four (4) mouzas are presented in **Table** 4. 5below.

4.3.4 Payment of Allowances by LAC/ PIU

25. During reporting period (July-December 2023) all the admissible allowances have been mostly paid to the entitled DPs of all four (4) mouzas. As per approved LARPs, 240 out of total 325 DPs have been paid for their 1,481 out of total 1,706 admissible allowances with paid amount of PKR 463.21 million (87.76 %) out of total PKR 527.779 million during reporting period. The unpaid 85 DPs having 225 unpaid number of allowances amounting PKR 64.57 million are undisbursed due to out of village while already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will be received their due allowances. All the admissible allowances amount for entitled DPs already deposited and secured in district treasure for payment to the DPs. Similarly, as per approved LARPs and LAR implementation no further

DPs are eligible in the remaining unpaid DPs of land compensation for any sorts of allowance in entire affected mouzas. A sample scan copy of payment receipt of allowances sheet is annexed at **Annexure-3**. All the admissible no. of allowance, no. of entitled DPs, payable allowances amount and progress of disbursement of allowances and its percentage is presented below in **Table** 4.6.

4.3.5 Section and Mouza (village) wise Hydropower Component and Cleared Acquired Land of BHP Project

26. The PIU is committed to complete the implementation process of LARP's in the entire project. On the basis of approved LARP's implementation progress achieved in the reporting period the PIU confirms that all payable DPs have been fully paid as per LARP's provision and there is no unpaid DP left without a valid legal and administrative impediment. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land is already deposited and secured in district treasury for payment to the unpaid DPs (70.3%) having legal/ administrative impediment as and when they will show-up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/ impediments. The Mouzas (village) under section-1 & 2 presented in gray, green and blue colours have been handed over to contractor upon the EMA's validation of LARP's implementation in 1st (December 23, 2022)⁸, 2nd (December 27, 2022)⁹ and 3rd (March 7, 2023)¹⁰ EMRs approved by ADB. Additionally, the IVS (already assessment completed) and LARP implementation in terms of compensation payment will run simultaneously towards the commencement of civil work and full implementation of LARP. Based on achieved progress LARP implementation status is presented at glance in **Table 4.7**.

27. Furthermore, the PIU confirms that unpaid compensation is secured in district treasury and unpaid DPs having legal/ administrative impediments have been fully informed about processing and payment of their claims as and when they show-up. However, all

exhaustive efforts on part of PIU and PMC will be continued till the completion of LARP's implementation. Therefore, the LARP implementation status under semi-annual social monitoring report (internal) for July-December 2023 where full implementation of LARP¹¹ is confirmed and already validated by the EMA in entire BHP Project (except of gap filing measures identified by IVS, if any).

Full implementation of LARP construe that the all-payable DPs have been fully compensated and payment of any differential amount assessed by IVS and unpaid DPs having impediments are approached and documented while the pending compensation costs are secured in the district treasury to ensure unpaid DPs having impediments are paid their entitled compensation as and when they approach after resolving their issues.

5 LARP IMPLEMENTATION MONITORING SET-UP

5.1 LARP Implementation Monitoring

- 28. Implementation and monitoring of LARP's in manner consistent with the project loan covenants and ADB's SPS 2009 provision is the key requirement for handing over of the sites to contractor and to proceeds on physical works at site. Therefore, for smooth and efficient implementation of LARPs, a safeguard management set-up at PIU as a focal unit for LARP implementation; maintaining updated LARP data about DPs with respect to compensation, entitlements and payment record, facilitate consultation meetings with stakeholders including DPs, project executors and district land revenue authorities; track and monitor day to day implementation progress and prepare periodic monitoring reports; maintaining a log of complaints received and redressed and facilitate project grievance redress committees to review and resolving the complainants.
- 29. Similarly, the LARP's implementation is also monitored externally through engagement of an external resettlement monitor (EMA) by PIU. The objective of resettlement monitoring is to validate implementation of LARP's, payment of compensation to DPs and livelihood restoration support and ensure safeguards monitoring compliance during implementation as per ADB's SPS 2009 guideline.

5.2 Exhaustive Efforts

- 30. Since, start of LARP's implementation on dated August 2, 2022, the PIU of BHPP through its safeguards management set-up, is closely coordinating with the land acquisition collector and the district land revenue offices to facilitate them in timely completion of land acquisition process, processing and payment of compensation to the DPs and ensure full implementation of LARP's before handing over of the sites to contractor for construction. Meanwhile the safeguards team headed by the Deputy Director Social and Resettlement has maintained a close liaison (photographs annexed) with the affected persons and local communities in the project affected villages to disclose LARP related information and facilitate DPs in accessing requisite valid claim documents i.e., getting their land titled documents from land revenue offices and CNIC (computerized national identity card) issued, opening of bank accounts and processing and payment of compensation. With coordinated efforts the land and non-land compensation has reached to a reasonably good percentage in all the four (4) mouzas of the BHP project by the office of the land acquisition collector of District Mansehra.
- 31. No doubt LARP implementation is a long, time consuming and challenging process, yet all possible exhaustive efforts to expedite the LARP's implementation process has been taken by the concerned project staff. Based on achieved compensation payment progress explained in previous sections, it is perceived and confirmed that all payable DPs have been compensated for their acquired land and assets while the left-over unpaid DPs are those who have valid legal/ administrative impediments. All such DPs have been approached and informed that the compensation amount has been secured in the district treasury account for payment to them as and when they will show-up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues. The PIU and PMC staff regularly monitor the progress of such cases on weekly basis of the paid and unpaid DPs as mentioned in the respective acquaintance roll at

revenue department and collected such data and used for monitoring purposes for each affected area. In addition to above, following Guidance Note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments of ADB is annexed at **Annexure-1** on handling of compensation cases having legal and administrative impediment, all accessible DPs (177 male DPs and 104 Female DPs) were approached and additional documents as needed have been recorded and maintained during the monitoring period by the safeguards team of PIU and PMC of BHPP. The efforts (photographs annexed) ensured by the PIU safeguards team for information dissemination and ensure participation of affected communities and in line government departments in smooth implementation of LARP's are summarized in sub-sections below.

5.3 Community Consultations/ Meetings

32. In order to expedite the LARP implementation process, PIU staff including Deputy Director Social and Resettlement, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender and Assistant Director Social and Resettlement along with PMC staff has regularly conducted the consultation meetings (photographs annexed) with men and women DPs of each affected mouza of the project. During the reporting period 24 meetings have been conducted with men and women DPs of the affected mouzas in which 177 men and 104 women DPs participated and addressed all their queries/ concern regarding compensation and allowances of their affected assets. Accordingly, they all were informed to receive their due share compensation and allowance amount from the revenue department. Similarly, wide publicity through print and electronic media and announcement in local mosque (masjids) along with installation of banners and LARP's information brochure distribution among the meeting participants as well as in the affected mouzas of the project. The below Table 5. 1shows the number of meetings along with participants in each sections/ mouzas under BHPP.

A summary of meetings conducted with Deputy Commissioner Mansehra and other district administration officials is given in **Table** 5.3 below.

5.5 Dissemination of LARP related Information 12

35. In order to expedite the LARP implementation process, Project Implementation Unit (PIU) supported by PMC has disseminated LARP's related information to all concerned DPs which include but not limited to; Installation of 10-banners at public offices such as AC/ Tehsildar's offices Balakot, service delivery center at Balakot and other public places like Masjids and Jamia Masjids of affected mouzas in the project area. During the exhaustive efforts, the PIU produced information related to LARP's implementation through print media i.e., local and national newspapers for awareness of public to receive their compensation. Various posters and flip charts have been displayed showing salient features of BHP Project. The safeguard team of PIU and PMC disseminated the LARP information brochure through community consultation meetings, and interaction with DPs at revenue department tehsil Balakot and other prominent places in each mouza of the project. Awareness among the DPs regarding LARP's has been created through social media link available at **Annexure-6**. The PIU staff along with the revenue department staff is frequently visiting the mouza's under section-1 and 2 for the purpose of disbursements of compensation and allowances.

6 PROJECT IMPACT ON WOMEN MOBILITY AND PRIVACY

36. During LAR implementation stage, there is no major impact recorded regarding women mobility and privacy in the project area due to project activities in the reporting period. The major activity is the information dissemination and facilitation by PIU/ PMC social safeguard team to disseminate the project LARP's information among the affected household and communities in the affected mouzas of the project. They were also informed regarding opening of bank account, preparation of valid CNIC (computerized national identity card) for receiving compensation amount smoothly against their affected land and non-land assets. The PIU, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender and Assistant Director Social and Resettlement along with PMC staff has regularly conducted the consultation meetings with women DPs of affected mouza of the project. During the reporting period multiple meetings have been conducted with women DPs of the affected mouzas in which 104 women DPs participated and addressed all their queries/ concern regarding compensation and allowances of their affected assets. However, the women of affected mouzas were also informed through consultation meetings of their male household member to receive their due compensation amount from the revenue department. The gender action plan (GAP) implemented in accordance with its terms under each output. Under the LARP's implementation the compensation and allowance have been provided to the eligible women DPs. The other outputs of GAP are linked with LRP implementation through the consultant NGO. All such activities of GAP will be implemented during implementation of LRP by the consultant NGO. The consultants NGO has been mobilized since September 7, 2023 in the project area.

6.1 Gender Issues/ Analysis in LARP's Implementation

37. During reporting period, there is no major impact recorded regarding gender issues particularly regarding women in disbursement of compensation and allowances. The LARP also identified the women DPs in terms of the loss of their assets. Like, male DPs the women are also receiving their payment, the PIU and PMC staff thoroughly facilitating the women in resolving their issues related to compensation/ allowances payment at district revenue office. The field staff regularly conducting consultation meetings with the women DPs to keep them update about the project, their compensation payment and addressing their issue if arise during disbursement. During the reporting period multiple consultations meetings/ sessions were held with women DPs in which 104 women participated. Attendance sheets of the consultation's meeting session is attached at **Annexure-4**.

7 LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT INTERVENTION MEASURE

7.1 Employment Opportunities

- 38. Under the output-4 of the project PAM, aimed to Income-earning opportunities and skills for local communities increased; relevant training facilitation support under the livelihood restoration plan (LRP) through engagement of non-government organization (NGO) will be provided i.e., Training on agriculture production, livestock rearing, beekeeping, fish farming and linkages with micro-finance institution, to the DPs or as per the local requirements particularly unemployed youths covering both men and women for relevant skill improvement/ capacity building to reduce impact on their livelihood. The engagement of consultants NGO's (non-government organization) which has been mobilized since September 7, 2023 in the affected project areas. The consultants NGO will conduct another round of consultations and livelihood assessment to upgrade the draft LRP into an implementation-ready level and implement thereof.
- 39. Furthermore, as per draft LRP, it is planned that livelihood skill development center for women for skill development/ capacity building will be established to cater short and long-term employment opportunities to the local affected person/ DPs. The livelihood skill development center for women will be established by consultants NGO as per approved ToR of consultants NGO and timeline of the center will be finalized by consultants NGO.

7.2 Short-Term Project Based Employment

40. The LARP provisioned for employment of local laborers and members of DPs. PIU has been followed up with contractors and project management consultants (PMC) in providing job opportunities to the locals. The information regarding employment opportunities disseminated through consultation meetings with DPs, distribution of information broachers and through GRCs members of each mouzas. As per the contractors record the project contractors and consultants have employed a total of 660 persons as short-term employment (skilled and un-skilled labor) of which 63.2 % (417 of the total 660) work force has been employed from the affected project area. All of the 417 persons are local work force (including 131 DPs) employed from the affected mouzas of the project. Hiring of skilled and unskilled labours from local project area is monitored by PIU on every month through the monthly progress report of contractors. For reference a list of skilled and un-skilled employment is annexed at **Annexure-11**. A summary of skilled and un-skilled labours working in project sites are presented below at **Table 7**.1.

8 GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISM AND COMPLAINTS HANDLING

8.1 Grievance Redress Mechanism

42. The GRM aims to mediate conflicts and response to complaints related to environment and social safeguard (LARP) performance of the project. At project level, the disbursement of compensation and allowance committee and grievance redress committees are operationalized for disbursement of entitled allowance and redressing grievances of affected communities. The field level GRCs has been notified on dated September 15, 2022 for mouza Ghanool and Sangar under section-1, for mouza Bela Sacha (separately) under section-2 notified on dated September 26, 2022 and for mouza Paras was issued on dated January 12, 2023 with the following composition and GRC notifications are annexed at the end of report at **Annexure-9**.

- 43. A complaint register is maintained at site with the contractors as well as in the office of the Project Director (PIU). The placing of the complaint register at contractor's camp is well publicized. Detailed Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) is affixed on sign board installed at Chief Engineer's office to guide complainant. The office of the Chief Engineer of the PMC is the first level to register and resolve the complaint if it is not addressed by the contractor. The Chief Engineer will deliver his decision within one week of registration of the case, if no understanding or amicable solution can be reached, or if the affected person does not receive a response from the Chief Engineer office within one week of the registry of the complaint, he/she can appeal to the GRC in writing to the office of the Project Director PIU-BHPP. The Committee at the PIU level will address the complaint on priority and is fully responsible to satisfy the complainant in terms of resolving his/ her complaint.
 - A number of meetings were held during the reporting period; however, it was decided by the GRC members that meeting will be held on need basis for smooth implementation of project activities and best interest of complainants as well. During LARP's implementation and formation of GRC's, most of the DPs are logging their complaints through GRC members while some of the DPs directly logging their

complaints to PIU. The LAR implementation is in process since August 2022, while the GRCs have been formed since September 2022 and mobilized and conducted meetings on need based. During reporting period (July-December 2023) eight (8) complaints received by PIU from the affected communities, while total 39 complaints received from the community till December 2023. As of now 38 out of 39 complaints have been resolved so far and there is only one (1) pending complaint unresolved. The one (1) unresolved complaint which is related to inclusion of missing/ additional DPs for dislocation/ chula allowance. The Project Director PIU of BHPP responded in the meeting held on December 7, 2023 at PIU, through a detail discussion and reply addressing all their grievances related to other monetary allowances. The outcomes of the meeting are summarized as under;

- PIU and the Project Management Consultants (PMC) stated that the communication and works department (C&WD KPK) did not assessed these structures as these were prefabricated and moveable. However, PD PIU did ask the GRC members of Mouza Paras to forward a written application to PIU for the assessment of these structures but so far, no applications have been submitted by any owners.
- Upon submission of applications by structure owners, PIU will coordinate with the
 district authority (DC Mansehra) for verification and resolution. The ADB's RETA
 consultant further clarified that there are legal procedures that require application.
 This includes submission of applications by the concerned owners of the structures
 to PIU through the GRC platform. The GRC members and complainant's
 representative agreed to submit written application to PIU but did not provide a
 specific time by when.
- PIU/PMC stated that according to the ADB's policy, all the affected structure located in the affected mouzas have been considered for allowances as per entitlement. Similarly, all the actual structures have been considered. However, if the structure number is different, means having a separate or unique MP number then it will be considered for shifting allowances.
- At this point, ADB's consultant stressed upon that all missed out structures (if any) requires proper evidence and supporting documents for claiming compensation and allowances. He further added that there is difference between shifting and dislocation allowance. Dislocation allowance will be awarded only once to the owner and shifting allowance is based on number of structures of the owners and severity allowance may be awarded if it is meeting the criteria mentioned in the LARP.
- PIU/PMC stated that field visits to all 4 mauzas were completed in March 2023 besides conducting several meetings with GRC members about additional DPs for Chulla allowance but the process is still incomplete. The GRC of Mouza Paras initially identified 279 DPs for Chulla allowance, which after thorough questions and clarifications came down to 124 cases by the demands of the GRC committee. Similarly, in Mouza Bela Sacha, DPs initially identified as 29 but came down to only 18 by the GRC committee, whereas in the Mouza of Sangar, the DPs is recorded as 10. The discussion/ meetings are still ongoing which will be finalized on provision of

the information by DPs for their eligibility) by PIU, GRC and PMC on the actual number of DPs eligible for Chulla allowance in accordance with criteria in approved LARPs in different Mouzas and once finalized will be shared with ADB accordingly.

- The ADB's Consultant added that the concept of Chulla allowance had never existed anywhere in ADB's project. However, it was first and recently introduced by WAPDA in DASU Hydropower project and concurrently PIU adopted/ considered such dislocation/ household Chulla allowance for the eligible DPs under BHPP as an effort to address any gap in land prices if the prices fall below "replacement cost" as required under SPS.
- The PD further added that, the number of DPs for Chulla allowance is 221 (191 DPs of Mouza Paras, 25 DPs of Mouza Sangar and 5 DPs of Mouza Bela Sacha) in the approved LARP and if there is any missing DPs from the approved figures/list, then they must be substantiated with proper proof/ documentation of evidences and after thorough verification by PIU/PMC, may consider for eligibility, otherwise such request/ application will not be entertained. All the requisite documents and information will be provided by the DPs through their concerned GRC committee. Such missing DPs should also be substantiated and verified by the author of LARP with reasons why they could not be identified during the process of LARP finalizing.
- PIU/PMC informed the forum that under approved LARPs all the admissible allowances were aligned and approved under ADB's safeguard policy statements 2009 (SPS 2009). Most of the DPs already received their allowances in advance. So, further consultations with DPs or recalculation of transition or house rent allowances is not required. Secondly, DPs have already received compensation and allowances amount as entitled in accordance with ADB's policy against their affected land and non-land assets.
- Regarding the request of GRC members to extend period of 2 years for shifting allowance, Consultant of ADB's added, that none of the ADB's project have been given transition allowance for one or two years to the DPs. Under approved LARP's of BHPP, the transition and house rent allowance has been given for 6- and 4months period respectively to the eligible DPs. However, this issue can be discussed with other high ups of ADB and PIU will be informed accordingly.
- The IVS report will be disclosed when it is approved by ADB. The report is currently under review by ADB.
- During reporting period multiple meetings have been conducted with all such complainants through GRC. A copy of meeting minutes of the GRC meeting is annexed at the end of report as Annexure-10.

As per LAA Standing Order 28, the Acquiring Officer is required, to the extent possible, to pay DPs in or near the DPs' village to facilitate collection of compensation.

- 4. Both the LAA (1894) and ADB SPS (2009) require that DPs are compensated before displacement but allow a mechanism for dealing with cases with legal and administrative impediments to disbursing compensation provided that sufficient goodfaith efforts are demonstrated to (a) contact, notify and assist DPs, and (b) deliver compensation payments. This guidance note clarifies:
 - What are cases with legal and administrative impediments to payment of compensation to DPs?
 - What are the requirements under the LAA related to cases with legal and administrative impediments to payment of compensation to DPs?; and,
 - iii. When can good-faith efforts be considered as sufficient and how to document that good-faith efforts have been made?
- Cases with legal and administrative impediments to payment of compensation include:
 - DPs who did not accept the award due to objection to the measurement of the land or affected asset, the amount of compensation, the person to whom it is payable, or the apportionment of the compensation among the persons interested;
 - Absentee landowners (DPs living overseas or in other parts of the country), and without an authorized representative to collect compensation;
 - iii. DPs with pending inheritance mutations;
 - iv. DPs who are unenthusiastic to collect meager compensation amount;
- DPs who are unable to alienate the acquired asset either by being a juvenile with no legally documented guardian or due to other issues.

6. Non-disbursement/non-delivery of compensation due to (a) insufficient funds or delay in approval of funds; or (b) insufficient staff or resources does not justify not paying compensation to DPs before displacement. EAs/IAs have the power and responsibility to ensure that sufficient funds and staffing are available in a timely manner to undertake the required land acquisition. Similarly, non-compensation of affected non-land assets (structures) and improvements by DPs who have no formal rights to the affected land is not considered as a valid legal and administrative impediment (see footnote 4).

Why is it important to address cases with legal and administrative impediments? 7. DPs facing legal and administrative impediments could only be paid when the impediments have been resolved. In such cases, it is uncertain when DPs will receive their compensation causing untoward delay in project implementation and burden to local communities and project stakeholders. More importantly, these impediments prevent the project from assisting these DPs to enhance, or at least restore, their livelihoods and to improve the standards of living of the displaced poor and other vulnerable groups.

Good-faith efforts for cases with 8. Compensation of these DPs is beyond the control of the EA. These are mainly dependent of the actions of the DPs or ruling/decision from a third-party i.e. the court or BOR. However, good-faith efforts are needed from the EA/IA to (a) contact and notify DPs through their last known address, village heads or kins; (b) inform DPs who to

legal and administrative impediments contact or where to proceed to collect their compensation; and (c) advise DPs on possible actions that may help them receive their compensation.

Need for sustained community outreach

- 9. It is important that the LAR management team⁸ undertakes continued community consultations and outreach to locate, assist and guide DPs with legal and administrative impediments. Documentation of the efforts by the LAR management team including multiple visits⁹ to DPs' villages, organizing village meetings, posting of notices in public places, serving notices at last known address of DPs and publishing the names of unpaid DPs in the print media is needed to demonstrate that due efforts were conducted in addressing cases with impediments to paying compensation.
- 10. Some issue-specific measures to confirm DPs understanding about the availability of compensation, payment mechanism, time-lines, and DPs agreement to the commencement of works (wherever required) while the issue is being resolved can help show and validate the efforts exhausted by the EA to achieve the policy objectives and enable the decision makers to allow the construction works accordingly. For each issue, documentation requirements and recording of certification statements are discussed below. Standard templates for additional documentation are provided against each issue as and wherever required:

Cases with title disputes and litigation

Land Title Disputes or Litigations among the DPs or Court References Against Award

- 11. When there is a dispute on the title of the affected land before a competent court of law or when DPs file references against award, compensation can only be made after the court decrees which may take years. Further, right to appeal against court's decree cannot be forfeited or denied under law which could further delay the payment. In such cases, payment of compensation in a given time frame is impossible and it would be appropriate to deposit compensation in treasury at courts disposal to make sure the DPs are paid as and when court verdict is passed. For these cases, the process provided in the succeeding paras should be followed.
- 12. Immediately after identifying such cases, the EA after seeking court's permission should deposit the compensation amount in the court for payment to the DPs as and when court decides their reference or title dispute. The receipt and records for such deposits should be maintained at the EA's project office. Meanwhile, the EA through its LAR staff should liaise with the DPs to inform them about the compensation payment mechanism and compensation deposited in the treasury or the court. The EA's project office should prepare and maintain the following record:
 - Database/listing and field reports on activities done to identify and screen DPs with their legal/administrative issues including nature of dispute and reference court where pending
 - · Field reports on activities done to coordinate with the DPs for early resolution of

The repeated visits should be documented showing visit schedule, information disclosure reports, list of persons met and field visit reports duly endorsed by the local community and the village headman confirming number of identified DPs with legal and administrative impediments.

Absentee land owners

Absentee Landowners (DPs Living Overseas or in Other Parts of the Country).

- 13. Many rural households migrate to cities for better livelihood opportunities and standard of living. Moreover, hereditary division over time resulted in the segmentation of agricultural land parcels into unproductive units. While some families with land and assets in different parts of the country divide their land based on their places of residence, many do so without legally formalizing such settlements and getting land records updated accordingly. Some family members who have migrated overseas permanently had land in their name or retained their respective share in family-owned land as per land revenue records. Such DPs who own or have share in the land as per record but are not living in the village are termed as absentee landowners.
- 14. Absentee landowners ¹⁰ are also recorded as DPs. The compensation to absentee land owners could not be made until they appear before the acquiring officer for processing and payment of compensation. LAA requires that notices are delivered against each land parcel either through (a) co-sharers in the acquired land parcel, (b) DPs relatives living in the village, or (c) through the village headman. The legal requirement is to serve notices to DPs at their places of residence either through special messenger or registered post, which can only be met if the whereabouts and residence of the absentee land owners is known. An additional measure that may be considered to notify absentee land owners whose whereabouts are unknown is to publish their names in print media (National Daily News Paper).¹¹
- 15. It is vital to collect information about the DP's contact details including the mailing and residential address. The following measures are proposed to contact absentee landowners and maintain record of all efforts made by the EA:
 - Identify and record DPs relation in affected village or local contact person, collect information about DP's present place of residence. See template 1 below:

Land owners who are recorded in the landholding rights register as owners but they have shifted from the village to other areas in the country or overseas for better income opportunities and living standard.

In NTCHIP tranche-1 and NHDSIP tranche—II projects (i.e. M-4 Faisalabad-Gojra Section (ADB Loan 2400) and Sukkur-Jacobabad (N-65) (ADB Loan 2540)) and the National Motorway M-4 Gojra-Shorkot Section Project (ADB Loan 3300), the notices with the names of the DPs who have not come forward to collect compensation were published in the National News Papers (Urdu language) as a last resort effort to approach unpaid DPs for compensation delivery.

iii) DPs with Pending Inheritance Mutations

16. Land records are maintained by the local land revenue authorities who are responsible to enter land mutation transactions as and when reported by the landowners and update land records accordingly. Some heirs of DPs who passed away fail to get inheritance mutations recorded and get land records updated accordingly. On average, land acquisition process is completed almost in two years. During the acquisition or after land awards are announced, some DPs pass away without receiving their entitled

compensation. Although the legal heirs of the deceased DP are eligible for compensation, they could not be paid until the inheritance mutation is recorded and remaining land of deceased DP is transferred in their name.

- 17. The law requires heirs of the DP to report to the local land revenue authorities about the demise of the DP and apply for the updating of the land record. Upon receipt of the application, the land revenue authorities undergo a legal process to record the inheritance mutation, update the land record reflecting the names of legal heirs and their respective shares in the land record. When it is done, the compensation can be paid to the legal heirs as per their respective share. This process normally takes three to four months. For cases where inheritance mutations are not timely reported, recording becomes more difficult and can take a longer period to complete.
- 18. When it is determined that the DP has passed away, the LAR management team should approach the legal heirs to apprise them on the process for getting compensation and assist them in approaching land revenue authorities to get their inheritance mutations recorded. The LAR management team should carry-out the following activities to facilitate the mutation of inheritance and early payment of compensation to the heirs and document their efforts:
 - Identify all living legal heirs of the DP, visit the heirs residing in the village and guide them on the process and facilitate in inheritance mutation process:
 - Collect a statement from the legal heirs¹² confirming that their inheritance
 mutation of land is pending, acknowledging the EA's efforts to assist them,
 indicating awareness that funds are available for compensation delivery, and
 concurring that works may commence while their inheritance mutation is being
 processed.
 - Keep copies of the signed statement in the EA project office files. See Template 3 below (to be translated to Urdu):

To the extent possible, all legal heirs living within the village should sign the Statement. If some heirs are not available to sign, the LAR management team should prepare a field report indicating who are the heirs who were not able to sign the statement and the circumstances why they were not able to sign i.e. out of the village or country, ill, etc. The LAR management team should also record the names of heirs who are out of the village or country and their last known address and advise the other heirs to relay the information to those who are away.

iv) DPs Who are Unable to Alienate the Acquired Asset:

DPs unable to alienate the land

- 19. Minors, juveniles and DPs with mental disability are not capable to alienate the acquired land under law. The law provides that compensation could be paid through legally-designated guardians or managers who can act and alienate the immovable property on behalf of the DP. In cases where the guardians are not designated by the court, the compensation is put on-hold until the minor attains the age of majority and claim compensation.
- 20. It is common that children inherit their parents' immovable properties, but is kept in possession and used by adult male members of the extended family or kinship group as a joint family asset. It is not a common practice to appoint guardians following the Guardians and Wards Act of 1890. Hence, compensation of DPs with minor age is kept on hold until the DP becomes of legal age unless a valid guardian certificate is produced. Although such cases are not many, it is important to guide the adults who provide care to these DPs to approach the right forum or court for appointing a guardian under law.
- The LAR management team should carry-out the following activities in dealing with pending guardian's appointment and in documenting its efforts:
 - Coordinate with the Living Parent or other grown up members of the household the DP is living with and guide them on the process of appointing a guardian.
 - Collect a certification statement from the Living Parent or other grown up member of the household the DP is living with, that i) confirms EA's efforts to notify and guide them and secure funds for compensation payment, ii) states that the appointment of guardian is pending, and iii) concurs to the commencement of civil works on the plot while the guardianship certificate is being processed. Such statement should be witnessed by the village headman and the village DPC chairman or member. See Template 4 below (to be translated to Urdu).

v) DPs with Meager Compensation

- 22. The compensation amount itself proves driving factor for DPs to submit their claims. In cases where small land holdings are in joint ownership with several entitled persons, shares in compensation for each DP become very small (\$100 and below). A good number¹³ of DPs fall in this category and they never show-up to collect compensation. The situation is further aggravated when such DPs also face other legal or administrative issues like pending inheritance mutations of acquired land or living overseas and other parts in the country.
- 23. Although the law provides a mechanism that includes cash payment at the village or payment through money order in case of absentee land owners ¹⁴, such is no longer practiced. The only available mode is payment through voucher debit-able to the treasury which requires the DP to travel repeatedly to the district/tehsil headquarter to receive their compensation, making the transportation cost higher than their compensation. This also requires that the DP has or opens a bank account.
- 24. The LAR management team should explore other payment modes allowed under the LAA including cash payment or payment through money order if the DP is living out of the project area. If such unclaimed compensations are deposited at court's disposal as legal remedy, it will be of no gain because a significant number of the DPs will remain unpaid. Following actions should be taken and recorded to explore specific measures and seek guidance from BOR in this aspect.
 - Define a maximum slab of amount to be termed as meager compensation and get it endorsed by the EA;
 - . Document coordination efforts with BOR including i) official correspondence and

Rectification of the names of any DPs as mentioned in acquaintance roll on priority basis. To facilitate and support the DPs at the time of voucher preparation regarding their affected land and nonland assets and khasra number as per the acquaintance roll. Completed the formation of graveyard committee for shifting of graveyards and directed the committee members for shifting of graveyards.

□ Completion of Payment of Public Built-up Properties and its evacuation:

The Deputy commissioner also informed about the pending payment of built-up properties (public and communal) to the respective department and communities. Accordingly, the DC and ADC directed the revenue staff to complete the required anomalies and procedures and clear all the outstanding payment as soon as possible.

□ Payment of Meager Compensation Amount:

Annexure-10: Meeting Minutes with Community Representative / Complainants

BALAKOT HYDROPOWER PROJECT

Meeting between Project Implementation Unit (PIU) and representatives of complainants and members of GRCs at PIU Balakot on 7th December 2023

Minutes of Meetings

A meeting of complainants/representatives and members of GRCs with PIU/ADB Consultant took place at PIU office Balakot on 7th December 2023. The meeting was convened by Project Director of Project Implementation Unit (PIU) of Balakot Hydropower Project at 12:00 a.m. List of participants is attached as annex 1. Key points discussed and actions agreed are presented below:

Key discussions and actions

The chair welcomed all the participants and started the meeting recitation from Holy Quran which followed discussions on the 5-point agenda items as below:

Item no. 1: Blue buildings that are yet to be assessed: The GRC members highlighted the blue roof structures (which they presented to PIU and ADB earlier also through emails and a virtual meeting with PIU) but the structures are still unassessed even after applications submitted to PIU and local administration office. This issue was deliberated by the members of GRCs with the Independent Valuation Study Team and the External Monitoring Expert of PIU, but the assessment is yet to commence. The members of GRCs requested PIU undertake a field assessment of these building structures for appropriate compensation to the owners of the buildings.

PIU response: PIU and the Project Management Consultants (PMC) stated that the communication and works department (C&WD KPK) did not assessed these structures as these were prefabricated and moveable. However, PD PIU did ask the GRC members of Mouza Paras to forward a written application to PIU for the assessment of these structures but so far, no applications have been submitted by any owners.

Action proposed: Upon submission of applications by structure owners, PIU will coordinate with the district authority (DC Mansehra) for verification and resolution. The ADB's RETA consultant further clarified that there are legal procedures that require application. This includes submission of applications by the concerned owners of the structures to PIU through the GRC platform. The GRC members and complainant's representative agreed to submit written application to PIU but did not provide a specific time by when.

Item no 2: Structures not meeting the LARP eligibility criteria for "Chulla" allowance: The project area has some structures that do not meet the eligibility criteria for CHULA allowances but still needs to be removed from the project site. According to ADB policy, these structures should be considered for relocation allowances, as outlined in the approved LARP. Therefore, GRC members requested that they be granted the allowances in accordance with ADB policy.

PIU Response: PIU/PMC stated that according to the ADB's policy, all the affected structure located in the affected mouzas have been considered for allowances as per entitlement. Similarly, all the actual structures have been considered. However, if the structure number is different, means having a separate or unique MP number then it will be considered for shifting allowances.

At this point, ADB's consultant stressed upon that all missed out structures (if any) requires proper evidence and supporting documents for claiming compensation and allowances. He further added that there is difference between shifting and dislocation allowance. Dislocation allowance will be awarded only once to the owner and shifting allowance is based on number of structures of the owners and

severity allowance may be awarded if it is meeting the criteria mentioned in the LARP.

Item No 3: Additional APs for "Chulla" allowance: Members of GRCs said that several affected families from Mauza, Paras, Bela Sacha, and Sangar did not receive their household dislocation/Chula allowance and were excluded from the approved LARP list. Subsequently, after submitting applications for additional assistance, PMC conducted an additional socioeconomic survey in February 2023. During this survey, 279 families from Paras, 29 families from Bela Sacha, and 10 to 12 families from Sangar underwent assessment. Following this socioeconomic survey, PMC initiated the verification process for families deemed eligible based on predefined criteria. Once verified, these families will be referred to ADB for further processing.

Reply:

PIU Response: PIU/PMC stated that field visits to all 4 mauzas were completed in March 2023 besides conducting several meetings with GRC members about additional DPs for Chulla allowance but the process is still incomplete. The GRC of Mouza Paras initially identified 279 DPs for Chulla allowance, which after thorough questions and clarifications came down to 124 cases by the demands of the GRC committee. Similarly, in Mouza Bela Sacha, DPs initially identified as 29 but came down to only 18 by the GRC committee, whereas in the Mouza of Sangar, the DPs is recorded as 10. The discussion/meetings are still ongoing which will be finalized on provision of the information by DPs for their eligibility) by PIU, GRC and PMC on the actual number of DPs eligible for Chulla allowance in accordance with criteria in approved LARPs in different Mouzas and once finalized will be shared with ADB accordingly.

The ADB's Consultant added that the concept of Chulla allowance had never existed anywhere in ADB's project. However, it was first and recently introduced by WAPDA in DASU Hydropower project and concurrently PIU adopted/ considered such dislocation/ household Chulla allowance for the eligible DPs under BHPP as an effort to address any gap in land prices if the prices fall below "replacement cost" as required under SPS.

The PD further added that, the number of DPs for Chulla allowance is 221 (191 DPs of Mouza Paras, 25 DPs of Mouza Sangar and 5 DPs of Mouza Bela Sacha) in the approved LARP and if there is any missing DPs from the approved figures/list, then they must be substantiated with proper proof/documentation of evidences and after thorough verification by PIU/PMC, may consider for eligibility, otherwise such request/ application will not be entertained. All the requisite documents and information will be provided by the DPs through their concerned GRC committee. Such missing DPs should also be substantiated and verified by the author of LARP with reasons why they could not be identified during the process of LARP finalizing.

Item No 4: Transition Allowance: The allowances outlined in the approved LARP, including house rent and transition allowances, were not calculated in alignment with ADB's policy, and the transition period was determined without consulting the affected community. Additionally, in the approved LARP, a transition period of six months is stipulated, while the house rent allowance covers only four months. Consequently, we earnestly request that ADB rectify the transition period in consultation with the affected community through mutual agreement and recalculate the transition and house rent allowances accordingly. This will ensure that the affected individuals receive their full entitlement in accordance with ADB's policy.

Response of PIU: PIU/PMC informed the forum that under approved LARPs all the admissible allowances were aligned and approved under ADB's safeguard policy statements 2009 (SPS 2009). Most of the DPs already received their allowances in advance. So, further consultations with DPs or recalculation of transition or house rent allowances is not required. Secondly, DPs have already received compensation and allowances amount as entitled in accordance with ADB's policy against their affected land and non-land assets.

Regarding the request of GRC members to extend period of 2 years for shifting allowance, Consultant of ADB's added, that none of the ADB's project have been given transition allowance for one or two years to the DPs. Under approved LARP's of BHPP, the transition and house rent allowance has been given for 6- and 4-months period respectively to the eligible DPs. However, this issue can be discussed with other high ups of ADB and PIU will be informed accordingly.

Item No 5: Fifth issue relates to IVS, which is currently in progress and eagerly anticipated by all stakeholders. We hope that the IVS report will promptly address the concerns raised in our complaint, including construction valuation, valuation of fruit trees, and land valuation. These matters require swift resolution, and we request that a comprehensive and precise report be prepared, taking into consideration our concerns and observations. Finally, we would like to begin by expressing our sincere apologies for any inconvenience caused due to our limited English proficiency. We are truly grateful to your entire ADB team for attending to our issues, and we hope they will assist us in resolving our concerns in accordance with ADB policies. We anticipate that they will take positive and concrete steps toward this goal.

PIU Response: The IVS report will be disclosed when it is approved by ADB. The report is currently under review by ADB

Meeting Wrap up:

The consultant of ADB concluded the meeting with the remarks that the issues raised by the community have been communicated to ADB/ PIU and other forums and are almost of the same nature as discussed in today's meeting. He further added that the IVS report is in its final stage and soon will be approved by ADB. The forum was praised by all the community members and the meeting ended with a vote of thanks.
