

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) is implementing the Balakot Hydropower Project (BHPP) with the financial assistance from Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank. The project will (i) improve energy security by increasing the clean energy share in the country's energy mix currently dominated by thermal power generation; (ii) boost the economy and promote revenue generating investments in the hydro-abundant Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Province; and (iii) build capacity and awareness on climate change impacts, adaptation and mitigation measures. The project has been divided into two sections for construction purposes. Therefore, two separate land acquisition and resettlement plans (LARPs) (section-wise) were prepared. The 1<sup>st</sup> Sectional LARP (Mouza Ghanool and Sangar) was approved by ADB on July 27, 2022,<sup>1</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP (Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras) was approved by ADB on November 29, 2022.<sup>2</sup>

2. As per approved 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP comprising Mouza Ghanool and Sangar, total acquired land is 848.40 Kanals (106.05 acres, including 168.2 Kanals of communal land) owned by 1,791 DPs and non-land impacts consisting of (i) 3,045 wood trees, owned by 1,725 DPs, and 876 fruit trees owned by 48 DPs; and (ii) 46 residential structures owned by 40 displaced persons (DPs) with 25 DPs requiring physically relocation. 1 commercial structure (only commercial structure affected but the owner/DP was not required relocate, and 1 masjid (common prayer place). However, the total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,791 to 1,874 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, owners of trees also increased from their original number (1,773 to 1,862 DPs). Nonetheless, the amount of compensation payable remains unchanged. Additionally, 39 DPs are eligible for different admissible allowances in the entire 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP.

3. As per approved sectional LARP 2 (covering the villages Bela Sacha and Paras), total acquired land is 962.950 Kanals (120.369 acres including 324.52 Kanals of communal land) owned by 1,766 DPs. Similarly, other LAR-related impacts included the following: (i) 9,189 wood trees owned by 1,457 DPs, and 1,448 fruit trees owned by 118 DPs; and (ii) 410 structures owned by 398 DPs (of which 196 DPs required physical relocation), and 9 communal or public structures, including 2 masjids (prayer place), 2 graveyards, and 5 government buildings (2 government schools, 1 basic health facility, 1 revenue office, and 1 forest office) in villages Bela Sacha and Paras.<sup>3</sup> However, total number of land DPs changed from the original number (1,766 to 1,821 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, the owners of trees also increased (1,575 to 1,647 DPs). Nonetheless, the amount of compensation payable remains unchanged. Additionally, 286 DPs are eligible for different admissible allowances in the entire 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP.

4. In addition to the land already acquired for the project, PIU is acquiring 15.4 Kanal (1.925 acres) of additional private land for slope stabilization at the dam's right side abutment in Mouza Bela Sacha. For this purpose, the LARP's addendum under section-1 and 2 to document the additional land in mouza Bela Sacha, additional compensation for the positive

differential between the replacement cost determined by the IVS and additional/ missing claims for admissible allowances of eligible DPs. Both sectional LARP's addendum has been approved by ADB on August 13, 2024, and uploaded on ADB's and PEDO websites.

5. As per approved Addendum of 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Ghool and Sangar, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1152 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 13.90 million of the same acquiring land. Additionally, 21 DPs are eligible for different admissible allowances against the payable amount of PKR 3.78 million.

6. As per the approved Addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,494 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 272.46 million of the same acquiring land. However, an additional land of 15.4 Kanal owned by 91 DPs and compensation amount is PKR 0.0922 million. Similarly, other LAR-related impacts included the following: (i) 380 wood trees owned by 91 DPs amounting PKR 0.7705 and 7 fruit trees owned by 1 DPs amounting PKR 0.1619 million; and (ii) 5 structures owned by 1 DP amounting PKR 11.061 million. Consequently, 285 DPs under different additional/ missing admissible allowances amounting PKR 128.43 million.

7. Implementation of LARP is monitored internally by the PIU and externally by an external resettlement monitor (ERM) engaged by PIU, and internal and external monitoring reports are provided to PIU and shared with ADB. This SSMR (internal) covers the implementation of both sectional LARPs 1 and 2 including addendum of LARPs for the period from July to December 2025. Implementation of sectional LARPs began in August 2022 by the PIU and Land Acquisition Collector (LAC), Mansehra District Officer Revenue. The implementation of sectional LARPs encountered delays due to frequent transfer and non-availability of relevant officials in the land revenue department, internal audit and engagement of revenue staff in the shifting of revenue office and staff and other developmental projects in District Mansehra. Nonetheless, the PIU, with support from the project management consultant (PMC), continued exhaustive efforts to move the compensation process, while also addressing the compensation cases stuck or impeded due to different administrative and legal reasons. No DPs have been physically displaced by PIU from housing so far, (while under already demolished structures no owners have been displaced as such demolished structures were vacant for a long time and not in use/ functional by any owners). Although many DPs left their structures after receiving full compensation from LAC office Mansehra. As of reporting period 502 DPs after being fully compensated left their structures voluntarily since April 2024. PIU and PMC continue to coordinate with the district revenue department/LAC office Mansehra to accelerate the disbursement of compensation and allowances to all unpaid DPs (including those with legal impediments to compensation). Staff of PIU/ PMC also continue to inform the unpaid DPs through their relatives and Patwaris to come forward and receive their compensation as soon as possible. These efforts of PIU and PMC are in accordance with ADB's guidance note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments in **Annexure-1**. Sample copies of impediment documents (scanned) are in **Annexure-2**.

8. **Issuance of public notices:** Following the land award in 2022, PIU and the District Administration/ Revenue Office issued five notices to all APs on the following dates: January 2024, February 2024, May 2024, Sept 2024 and May 2025 but not all APs evacuated/

demolished their structures. This continues causing delays in construction work and affecting the construction plan prepared keeping in view the river low flow seasons. However, through this protocol and the notices already issued and disseminated in the affected villages/ mouzas during the reported period. Similarly, all APs are bound to vacate/ demolish the structure within 15 days (or before if possible) from the date of issuance of the final notice. The notices has been delivered to all APs (structure owner/user) through the Revenue Officials (Patwaris) personally and a copy of the notices fixed/ pasted on the main gate/boundary wall of the affected structure. The process of issuance of notices, payment of compensation and evacuation/ demolition of structures may also be validated by the external monitoring consultant of PIU.

**9. Status of Implementation of Approved LARPs:** As per approved sectional LARPs (section-1), PKR 113.65 million (80.49%) of the total payable land compensation amount of PKR 141.19 million has been disbursed to 1020 of total 1,874 DPs (54.43%, 1,791 DPs of approved LARPs, and 83 DPs of inheritance mutation) for land of 633.21 Kanal (79.15 acres) out of total 848.40 Kanal (106.05 acres) or 74.64% in two villages under section-1. Accordingly, for trees compensation, 980 of total 1,862 DPs (52.63%) received PKR 27.41 million out of total PKR 32.71 million (83.82%). Moreover, affected built-up property compensation paid to 100% of total 40 DPs with an amount of PKR 72.52 million of total PKR 74.53 million (97.30%) in two villages under section 1 of BHPP. Similarly, LAC (revenue department) and PIU supported by PMC are responsible for all types of payments of allowances, such as for severity, vulnerability, structure relocation, shifting for houses, transition, business moving assistance, house rent, business allowance for 12 months, electricity, and household dislocation (Chula) allowance. As per the approved LARPs in the affected two villages of the project, 38 DPs of total 39 DPs (97.4%) have been paid for all their admissible allowances, including dislocation (Chula) allowance, and 17 DPs are paid for their vulnerability allowance amounting PKR 59.50 million of total PKR 59.56 million (99.9%). The 1 unpaid DP of allowance amounting PKR 0.063 million are undisbursed mainly because of DP is out of the village despite of repeated reminder to their relatives. The DP was already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will receive their due allowance once he returns to the village.

10. As per approved sectional LARPs (section-2), PKR 296.95 million of the total payable land compensation amount of PKR 426.50 million (69.62%) has been disbursed to 927 of total 1,821 DPs (50.91%, 1,766 DPs of approved LARPs, and 55 DPs of inheritance mutation) for land of 485.75 Kanal (60.72 acres) of total 962.95 Kanal (120.369 acres) (50.44%) in two villages under section-2 of BHPP. Accordingly, for trees compensation, 469 DPs of total 1,647 DPs (28.48%) received PKR 44.84 million out of total PKR 49.10 million (91.32%). Moreover, affected built-up property compensation was paid to 100% of total 398 DPs with an amount of PKR 1,323.32 million of total PKR 1,424.47 million (92.90%) in two villages under section 2 of BHPP. Similarly, LAC (revenue department) and PIU supported by PMC is responsible for all types of payments of allowances such as severity, vulnerability, structure relocation, shifting for houses, shifting for commercial structures, transition, business moving assistance, house rent, business allowance for 12 months, electricity and household dislocation (Chula) allowance. As per approved LARP section 2 in the two villages affected of the project, 248 of total 286 DPs (86.71%) have been paid for all their admissible allowances, including

dislocation (Chula) allowance, and 48 DPs are paid for their vulnerability allowance amounting PKR 463.64 million of total PKR 468.21 million (99.02%). The 38 unpaid DPs of allowances amounting PKR 4.60 million are undisbursed mainly because these DPs are out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will receive their due allowances once they return to the village.

11. Hence, overall, 286 total of 325 DPs have been paid PKR 523.12 million of total PKR 527.78 million (99.12%) as of end of the reporting period in all four villages of the project. Overall status of disbursement of LARP (land and non-land assets compensation and allowances) in mouzas/ villages under each section are in chapter 4. Scanned copies of land and non-land assets compensation and allowance voucher (payment receipt) are in **Annexure-3**. Table ES-1 shows the progress during previous quarters, progress during reporting period July-December 2025 and overall cumulative progress. Table ES-2 shows the paid and unpaid DPs of land and non-land compensation amount under each category. Table ES-3 shows the number of DPs for the number of admissible type of allowances in all affected mouzas/ villages.

**12. Status of Implementation of Approved LARP Addendums:** Under the approved Addendum of 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Ghanool and Sangar, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,152 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 13.90 million of the same acquiring land. However, no DPs have been paid at the end of reporting period under IVS compensation acquaintance roll due to lack of interest in the compensation amount. Although, 9 of total 21 DPs (42.85%) have been paid for all their additional/ missing admissible allowances, amounting PKR 3.34 million of total PKR 3.78 million (88.45%). The 12 unpaid DPs of additional/missing allowances amounting to PKR 0.44 million are undisbursed mainly because these DPs are out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will receive their due additional/ missing allowances

once they return to the village. Table ES-4 shows the progress under the LARP's addendum during reporting period, July-December 2025 are as under.

13. Similarly, under the approved Addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,494 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 272.46 million of the same acquiring land. An amount of PKR 140.51 million (51.57%) of the total payable IVS land compensation amount of PKR 272.46 million has been disbursed to 782 of total 1,494 DPs (52.34%) in mouza Paras only. In addition to this, the additional land compensation payment an amount PKR 0.0086 million of the total payable compensation amount of PKR 0.0922 to 1 of total 91 DPs in mouza Bela Sacha only (the sluggish disbursement of land compensation amount is due to meager amount of almost all unpaid DPs). Similarly, under the fruit trees compensation paid to 1 DPs of total 1 DPs (100%) received PKR 0.162 million out of total PKR 0.162 million (100%). Moreover, affected built-up property (5 structures) compensation under additional land has been paid to 1 of total 1 DPs with an amount of PKR 11.061 million of total PKR 11.061 million (100%) in the only mouza Bela Sacha under section 2 LARP addendum against the additional land for BHPP. Consequently, under the approved addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP, 89 of total 285 DPs (31.23%) have been paid for all their additional/ missing admissible allowances amounting to PKR 118.65 million (92.38%) of total payable PKR 128.43 million. The unpaid 196 DPs of additional/ missing allowances amounting PKR 9.78 million are undisbursed mainly because DPs are out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors and soon will receive their due additional/ missing allowances amount once they return to the village. Table ES-4 shows the summary progress under the LARP's addendum during reporting period, July-December 2025 are as under.

14. The field staff of PIU and PMC continued to support the revenue department staff to expedite the disbursement of compensation to the DPs of both sectional LARPs. PIU/PMC collected the field data of both sectional LARPs, and prepared the required documentation of the DPs whose compensation payment is unpaid due to legal and administrative impediments. Consultation meetings with DPs and awareness campaigns were launched by PIU/PMC in their efforts to reach out to the DPs. A scanned copy of these efforts is in **Annexure-4**.

15. The LARP implementation status during the reporting period (July-December 2025) is in Table 4.7 in chapter 4 (section-wise mouzas highlighted in gray, green, blue and orange colors where full implementation of LARP is confirmed and already validated by the EMA (External Resettlement Agent of PIU) through the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> EMRs, respectively. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land is already deposited and secured in the district treasury for payment to the unpaid DPs having legal/ administrative impediments as and when they will show up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/ impediments. The PIU confirms that all DPs other than those unpaid due to legal and administrative impediments have been fully compensated for all LAR impacts and payable allowances in all mouzas under 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional approved LARPs and its addendum as of December 2025. The detailed list of paid and unpaid DPs of land, trees and built-up property of each mouzas was previously provided in 3<sup>rd</sup> SASMR (July-December 2022) for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras which available separately in Appendixes-13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18, while for mouza Sangar provided in 2<sup>nd</sup> SASMR (July-October 2022) available in Appendixes-1, 2 and 3, and for mouza Ghanool provided in 1<sup>st</sup> SASMR (July-October 2022) available in Appendix-5.

16. The findings of the internal SSSMR of July-December 2025 for both the sectional LARPs 1 and 2 show that from the total 3,695 DPs of all 4 villages, 1,947 DPs have been fully compensated, whereas the remaining 1,748 DPs are still unpaid due to different reasons (i.e. legal and administrative impediments) that are beyond PIU's power to address or resolve alone. The details of unpaid 1,748 DPs by type of impediment are as follows: 43 DPs have court cases on internal family disputes; 50 DPs live/ work abroad; 172 DPs have inheritance mutation issues; 1,025 DPs continue to remain disinterested in receiving compensation due to meager amount compensation; 4 DPs are juvenile and do not have either national identity card (CNIC) or guardian certificates, which PIU and LAC require to address this impediment to the compensation disbursement; 188 DPs live out of city; and 266 DPs out of village. While PIU/PMC continue to reach out to the unpaid DPs through different means and make all possible efforts in addressing all types of impediments to compensation, no unpaid DPs have been dislocated so far. Table ES-5 presents a detailed summary of unpaid DPs (by category of impediment) for a clear understanding of the situation.

17. The institutional set up of PIU has well established safeguards management arrangements with social and environmental management specialists available full time for implementation and internal monitoring of sectional LARPs, environmental impact assessment, environmental management plan, and site-specific environmental management plans. Overall, Project Director BHPP at PIU is responsible for implementing and ensure compliance with social and environmental safeguard requirements of ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement 2009 (SPS), and project-specific requirements of social and environment

safeguards. PD PIU and the Safeguard Unit are further assisted by the PMC, which the services of social and environmental specialists have made available to PIU under PMC.

18. The safeguard unit/team at PIU is headed by Deputy Director Social & Resettlement responsible for implementation of LARP supported by Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and Patwaris (land record keeper). The BHPP staff regularly conducted meetings with Deputy Commissioner (DC), Mansehra and revenue department staff, including Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC), Assistant Commissioner (AC), Tehsildar and Patwari (land record keeper) of Tehsil concerned, to pursue disbursement of all types of compensation and allowances on fast track, and the meager compensation amount to the unpaid DPs as soon as possible. The minutes of meeting with DC/ADC/revenue officials are annexed in **Annexure-5**.

19. PIU, supported by safeguard unit team and PMC safeguard experts, is making continuous efforts to expedite implementation of sectional LARPs. Part of this effort includes dissemination to the DPs through installation and display public banners at public offices such as AC/Tehsildar office Balakot service delivery center at Balakot, and public places Jamia Masjid, and notable places in the affected mouzas of the project. Under exhaustive efforts, the PIU provided LARP-related information to DPs through public advertisements published in local newspaper and other means of social media informing the DPs about compensation and allowances they can receive from the concerned Tehsildar office of revenue department. A copy of the advertisement and link to social media are annexed at **Annexure-6**. The additional measures undertaken by the project through addendum of LARPs based on IVS assessment to validate replacement rates and additional/ missing admissible allowances were already communicated to the DPs through information brochure on LARP in Urdu (local) language among the DPs in all the affected mouzas of the project. The process of dissemination of information brochures is going on till the complete payment of compensation and allowances in the affected mouzas. A scanned copy of information brochure of LARP in Urdu/local language is in **Annexure-7**.

20. To facilitate and expedite disbursement of allowance (payable to DPs as per sectional LARPs), an “Allowance Disbursement Committee” has been constituted under the Chairmanship of ADC (general) Mansehra along with Deputy Director Social and Resettlement of PIU, supported by PMC. The committee members examine every single case of allowance with assistance from PIU/PMC field staff to ascertain and verify the required information for considering any DPs for a particular allowance. The LAC/PIU staff, after completing all the verifications, prepare/sign the payment vouchers for eligible DPs. The notification of the LARP's committee for allowances is annexed at the end of report at **Annexure-8**.

21. The project's Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) is fully operational. The village level Grievance Redress Committees (GRCs) for Ghanool and Sangar were established and made fully functional on 15 September 2022 under sectional LARP 1, whereas GRCs for Bela Sacha and Paras were established under sectional LARP 2 on 26 September 2022 and 12 January 2023, respectively. Additionally, a female Grievance Redress Committees (GRC) also have been formed by PIU for the resolution of female concern related to Project. All GRCs in all four villages are fully functional, and several meetings have been held during the reporting period. However, it was decided by the GRC members that meetings will be held on need basis for the smooth implementation of project activities and best interest of complainants as well. The notifications of GRC committees are annexed in **Annexure-9**. All DPs and local community of the four villages have been fully informed about the GRM and GRCs available to them through community consultation meetings as well as through LARP information brochure dissemination. DPs have been informed about how they can access GRM/GRCs and file any concerns or grievances with the contractors working on the sites, PIU and PMC.

22. **Applications/ Concerns/ Demands of DPs Submitted to PIU/ GRC:** Since inception, a total of 61 applications/ concerns/demands registered under GRC which were received by PIU from the affected communities. Out of total 59 applications/ concern/ demands , i.e., 2 applications regarding pending labor wages, 27 concerns/ apprehension related to additional/missing allowances, 10 applications related to internal family disputes on LARP's allowances, 4 concern regarding partial assessment of built-up property, 6 concern about

demanding of business allowances, 3 applications regarding objection on the GRC members of village Paras GRC and 1 application related to damage of material mixture machine by local administration have been resolved amicably with the complainant's consensus and 4 applications/ concerns/ demands have been registered through GRC and 2 applications/ concerns received from ADB through email to PIU. During the reporting period, total 2 complaints/ applications/ demands received by PIU, which have been resolved and closed by the village level GRC and they were informed about the decision accordingly.

**23. Complaints of DPs Submitted to ADB's Accountability Mechanism: Office of Special Facilitator (OSPF) and Compliance Review Panel (CRP):** Before implementation of LARP-1, OSPF received one complaint in June 2022 from the village which was related to land acquisition, valuation and compensation. However, CRP received two complaints in January 2024 regarding missing business allowance from the village Bela Sacha. Parallel commencement of LARP's implementation, PIU completed an IVS that determined a differential in the awarded prices and IVS rates. The IVS differential has been approved by the provincial government for additional payments to DPs through the addendum LARP's which has been approved by ADB. Similarly, the CRP complainant provided additional documents to support his claims of business allowance. Based on the requisite document provided by complainants, PIU has been accepted the claims for business allowance under the approved LARP's addendum eligibility criteria. Similarly, the complainant's provided a satisfaction certificate to PIU and was annexed at annexure-11 in the previous SASMR (January- June 2024).

24. The sectional LARPs have provision for employment of local laborers and DPs. PIU continued to follow up with contractors for providing job opportunities to the locals and DPs. The PIU strongly intimated the contractor to provide job opportunities to the affected community on priority basis either skilled or unskilled. The contractors maintained a list of skilled and unskilled employed persons monthly, and the Deputy Director Social and Resettlement of PIU is responsible for monitoring and verification of these list of the affected community (locals). The affected community is aware of the job opportunities through community meetings, and meetings with local administration at the tehsil and district levels. The contractor submitted a monthly progress report including data/information of employed persons and locally/ affected community. Similarly, the Deputy Director social and resettlement of PIU regularly monitored the locally employed persons with the contractors. As per the contractor record, the contractor, consultants, PIU and consultant-NGO have employed a total of 2,643 persons for short-term employment (skilled and un-skilled labor), of which 1,692 (64.02%) are locals, including 856 DPs employed from the affected mouzas of the project. Hiring skilled and unskilled laborers from the local project area is monitored by PIU every month through the monthly progress reports of contractors. A list of skilled and unskilled people employed by the contractors during the reporting period is in **Annexure-10**.

25. Similarly, long-term project-based employment which is related to output-4 of the project including, relevant training facilitation support under the livelihood restoration plan (LRP) will be provided, i.e. training on agriculture production, livestock rearing, beekeeping, fish farming and linkages with microfinance institution, to the DPs or as per the local requirements, particularly unemployed youths covering both men and women, for relevant skill improvement/ capacity building. This will reduce their impact on their livelihood during project

implementation. All such training linked and included in LRP of BHPP will be conducted by consultants NGO. The consultant NGO has been mobilized since September 7, 2023. The LRP has been approved by ADB on dated April 24, 2025 and the implementation of LRP is ongoing by consultants NGO.

26. The LARP implementation is also externally monitored through an EMA by PIU. The EMA has been mobilized since June 9, 2022, and submitted external SASMRs to PIU/ADB regularly. On validation of EMA under 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARPs, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> SASMRs (external by EMA) for mouza Ghanoor and Sangar (separately) was approved by ADB on December 23, 2022, and December 27, 2022, respectively. Under 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP, the 3<sup>rd</sup> SASMR (external by EMA) for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras was approved by ADB on March 7, 2023. The ERM has submitted its last External Monitoring Report (EMR) for July to December 2024 to ADB and approved which was disclosed on June 9, 2025.

## 1 INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Project Background

27. The Islamic Republic of Pakistan has received a loan for “Balakot Hydropower Development Project”, from ADB loan 4057 PAK and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank loan 8397 with the cost of \$665 Million, including counterpart fund of \$115 million, for the entire BHPP. This is the SASMR (internal) on LARP implementation for the period from July to December 2025 of BHPP.

28. The KP Energy and Power Department is the executing agency, and PEDO is the implementing agency. The PIU was established in May 2019 at PEDO office, Peshawar to manage all the project activities associated with LARP. The PIU is headed by a Project Director responsible for execution and implementation of LARP, and also to ensure the availability of funds for LARP implementation. The PD PIU, with the assistance of Deputy Director Social & Resettlement, Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and other staff, is responsible for the timely updating, implementation and monitoring of LAR activities.

29. BHPP is classified as category “A” because the involuntary resettlement impacts of ADB supported project are considered significant as more than 200 persons are experiencing major impact, i.e. losing 10% or more of their productive assets or physically relocating.

### 1.2 Project Objectives

30. The BHPP aims to develop a 300 megawatt (MW) run-of-river hydropower scheme on the Kunhar River in Kaghan Valley, between Balakot and Kaghan, Manshera District of KP. The project is aligned with the carbon footprint reduced, and energy sector made more renewable, efficient and reliable. The Project has the following major objectives to achieve:

- **Climate-resilient hydropower plant commissioned:** A 300 MW hydropower plant will be commissioned near Balakot City in KP Province.
- **Capacity for climate change risk management in hydropower production enhanced:** Awareness will be developed among the communities with specific training for women and youth groups to serve as climate change leaders.
- **PEDO's revenues from indigenous resources increased.** PEDO will supply one-third of the electricity generated from the 300 MW hydropower plant to the Peshawar Electricity Supply Company, and the rest to the National Transmission Dispatch Company Limited.
- **Income-earning opportunities and skills for local communities increased.** During construction, the local population will benefit from job opportunities, commercial activities, and material supply. The project will generate more than 1,200 skilled and unskilled jobs for male and female workers, of which about 40% will be sourced locally.

### 1.3 Project LARP Description

31. Resettlement Monitoring and Evaluation is an integral part of the social safeguard requirements (Involuntary Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples), including the LAR process covering the preparation, implementation and monitoring of LARPs. This is a requirement under ADB's SPS and the corresponding loan and project agreements. The BHPP has been divided into two sections for construction purpose. Therefore, two separate LARPs (section-wise) were prepared for the entire project. The 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP<sup>4</sup> (mouza Ghanoor and Sangar) and 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP<sup>5</sup> (mouza Bela Sacha and Paras) were approved by ADB on July 27, 2022 and November 29, 2022, respectively. Therefore, this SASMR (internal) is prepared for both sections and all affected mouzas under the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARPs. In addition to the land already acquired for the project, PIU is acquiring 15.4 kanal (1.925 acres) additional private land for slope stabilization at dam right side abutment in Mouza Bela Sacha. Acquisition of land and LAR impacts and compensation was documented under LARP addendum, which has been approved by ADB. More information on the project sections, component of BHPP, mouza, acquired land affected (only) and number of DPs are summarized in Table 1.1.

### 1.3.1 Section-1: Mouza Ghanool and Sangar (under 1<sup>st</sup> Sectional LARP)

#### 1.3.1.1 Mouza Ghanool

32. Based on approved 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises of Surge Shaft and access road to Surge Shaft in Mouza Ghanool. A land of 30.95 kanal (3.87 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned dam component/infrastructure under section-1. As per LARP implementation in mouza Ghanool under paid land of 21.36 Kanal (2.67 acres) (69.01%), comprise maximum 2.91 kanal (0.363 acres) (13.62%), minimum 0.03 kanal (0.00375 acres) (0.14%), and average 0.218 kanal (0.2727 acres) (1.02%) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 9.59 Kanal (1.20 acres) (30.99%), comprise maximum 2.93 kanal (0.366 acres) (30.55%), minimum 0.023 kanal (0.0028 acres) (0.24%), and average 0.15 kanal (0.019 acres) (1.56%) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. Location map of mouza Ghanool (section-1) is in Figure 1.1.

#### 1.3.1.2 Mouza Sangar

33. Similarly, as per approved 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises Access Tunnel to Cavern Powerhouse, access roads, tailrace, staff colony, and switch yard in mouza Sangar. A land of 817.45 kanal (102.18 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned dam component/infrastructure in mouza Sangar under section-1. As per LARP implementation in mouza Sangar under paid land of 611.85 kanal (76.48 acres) (74.84%), comprise maximum 24.07 kanal (3.01 acres) (3.94%), minimum 0.00033 kanal (0.0000413 acres) (0.000073%), and average 0.66 kanal (0.08 acres) (0.12%) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 205.60 Kanal (25.7 acres) (25.15%), comprise maximum 7.17 kanal (0.896 acres) (3.46%), minimum 0.0002 kanal (0.00025 acres) (0.00096%), and average 0.063 kanal (0.0078 acres) (0.030%) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP implementation and as per revenue record, no DP was identified as squatter or unregistered user of the affected land plots. Location map of mouza Sangar (section-1) is in Figure 1.1.

### **1.3.2 Section-2: Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras (under 2<sup>nd</sup> Sectional LARP)**

#### **1.3.2.1 Mouza Bela Sacha**





Figure 1.2: Location Map of Section-2 of BHP Project

34. Based on approved 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises Dam Right Side Abutment, Reservoir, Diversion/Sediment By-Pass Tunnel and Access Road to Diversion/Sediment bypass Tunnel in mouza Bela Sacha. A land of 175.575 kanal (21.947 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned dam component/infrastructure in mouza Bela Sacha under section-2. As per LARP implementation in mouza Bela Sacha under paid land of 143.55 kanal (17.94 acres) (81.75%), comprise maximum 12.87 kanal (1.61 acres) (8.96%), minimum 0.00001 kanal (0.00125 acres) (0.008%), and average 1.25 kanal (0.129 acres) (0.87%) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 32.025 Kanal (4.003 acres) (18.24%), comprise maximum 1.16 kanal (0.145 acres) (3.62%), minimum 0.002 kanal (0.0025 acres) (0.046%), and average 0.34 kanal (0.04 acres) (1.06%) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP implementation and as per revenue record, no DP was identified as squatter or unregistered user under the affected land plots. Location map of mouza Bela Sacha (section-2) is in Figure 1.2.

#### **1.3.2.2 Mouza Paras**

35. Similarly, based on approved 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP of the project, BHPP component comprises Dam Left Side Abutment, Reservoir, Intake of Headrace Tunnel and Access Road to Dam Crest in mouza Paras. A land of 787.375 kanal (98.422 acres) has been acquired for the above-mentioned dam component/infrastructure in mouza Paras under section-2. As per LARP implementation in mouza Paras under paid land of 342.20 kanal (42.78 acres) (43.46%), comprise maximum 10.90 kanal (1.36 acres) (3.18%), minimum 0.0045 kanal (0.00043 acres) (0.0010%), and average 0.44 kanal (0.058 acres) (0.14%) of land impacted as per paid DPs. Similarly, under unpaid land of 445.18 Kanal (55.65 acres) (56.54%), comprise maximum 4.60 kanal (0.575 acres) (1.03 %), minimum 0.0010 kanal (0.000125 acres) (0.00021%), and average 0.17 kanal (0.021 acres) (0.038%) of land impacted as per unpaid DPs. During LARP implementation and as per revenue record, no DP was identified as squatter or unregistered user of the affected land plots. Location map of mouza Paras (section-2) is in **Figure 1.2**.

**Figure 1.1: Location Map of Section-1 of BHP Project**

## **2 INTERNAL MONITORING REPORT OF LARP IMPLEMENTATION**

### **2.1 Internal Monitoring Requirements of LARPs**

36. The LARP implementation is internally monitored by the safeguard's unit in PIU and an ERM is engaged to review and validate the monitoring progress, and deliver EMRs. Internal monitoring is conducted on semi-annual basis, and this LARP implementation SASMR for the period from 1<sup>st</sup> July to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2025 of BHPP covers both approved sectional LARPs as well as Addendum to LARPs. Implementation of sectional LARPs began in August 2022 while under addendum to LARP's initiated in December 2024 by the PIU and LAC, Mansehra District Revenue Office. The implementation of sectional LARPs encountered delays due to frequent transfer and non-availability of relevant officials in the land revenue department, internal audit and engagement of revenue staff in the shifting of revenue office and staff and other developmental projects in District Mansehra. Nonetheless, PIU with support from PMC consultants continued exhaustive efforts to move the compensation process while addressing the compensation cases stuck or impeded due to different administrative and legal reasons. No DPs have been physically displaced by PIU from housing so far, although many DPs left their structures after receiving full compensation from PIU. This has been confirmed by PIU's EMA in his last external SASMR of July to December 2024. However, compensation has been disbursed accordingly, and the land and non-land affected owners compensated as per provisions of the approved LARPs and under Addendum to LARPs. This LARP SASMR (internal) for July-December 2025 shows the status of full implementation of LARP in all mouzas which is previously validated by the EMA through his 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> EMRs.

### **2.2 Objectives of the Internal Monitoring Report**

37. This internal monitoring report presents the safeguards management progress achieved, and coordination and consultations to mobilize and assist the DPs for receiving compensation and redress their grievances. It summarizes the progress on following aspects:

- Delivery of compensation for assets and entitled allowances under approved LARPs and its addendums.
- Collection of DPs data and preparation of LAR record, issues and progress.
- Activities and actions for the compensation of payment to the DPs with which efforts were implemented by recording additional documentation as required under ADB's SPS 2009 guidance notes on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments.
- Community consultation and information dissemination activities performed for compensation disbursement.
- Updates on recording and handling of grievances.
- Employment (skilled/ unskilled) data of DPs and local community who got opportunity in the construction work.
- Any scope changes, design changes, new and unanticipated LAR impacts and damages, if any.

## **2.3 Monitoring Indicators**

38. Specific monitoring benchmarks are based on the approved sectional LARPs and its addendum cover the following:

- Mouza (village) wise disbursement of compensation and status of land acquisition in all affected Mouzas of BHPP under approved sectional LARPs and its addendums.
- Information campaign and consultation with DPs.
- Status of land acquisition and payments on land compensation.
- Status of all trees and structures compensation.
- Status of payment for all admissible allowances.
- Income restoration activities.
- Adherence to gender mitigation measures (complaints/ grievances) in the LARP during bi-annual internal monitoring and reporting process.
- Employment opportunities.

### **3 INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT AT PIU FOR BHPP**

#### **3.1 LARP's Implementation and Monitoring Set-up**

39. The safeguards management set-up makes the PIU responsible for timely and smooth implementation of LARP and its addendum for BHPP. Under supervision of the PD, PIU staff kept a close liaison with the LAC, district land revenue offices and the DPs to facilitate processing and delivery of compensation claims to the DPs. The safeguards set-up of PIU headed by PD include Deputy Director Social & Resettlement, Deputy Director Land Acquisition, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender, Assistant Director Social & Resettlement and Patwaris (land record keepers) revenue. In addition, the Land Acquisition Collector/ DC Mansehra from District Land Revenue Department with land revenue staff is supporting PIU/ PMC in land acquisition and payment of awarded compensation under Land Acquisition Act (LAA) 1894.

#### **3.2 Project Steering Committee**

40. The Project Steering Committee comprises under the Chairmanship of Additional Chief Secretary, KP and DC Mansehra. During the reporting period, no Project Steering Committee meeting have been conducted as meetings are conducted on need basis. However, DC Mansehra, directed the revenue staff to ensure disbursement of land compensation and allowances on fast track to the unpaid DPs under approved LARPs and its addendum.

#### **3.3 Disbursement of Allowances by LAC/ PIU**

41. The LAC and PIU are responsible for payments of allowances such as severity, vulnerability, shifting allowance for house/ commercial, transition, house rent, business, electricity, structure relocation, household dislocation allowances and business moving assistance. For this purpose, an allowances disbursement committee (notification in **Annexure-8**) has been constituted at the office of LAC/ DC under the chairmanship of ADC along with Deputy Director Social & Resettlement and Assistant Resettlement Expert of PMC. The committee members keenly examine every single case with assistance of PIU staff in order to ascertain required information for considering any individual for a particular allowance. The LAC/ PIU staff, after completing all the verifications out in the field, submit its report to the committee, and then the vouchers are accordingly signed. As soon as the committee completes its review and signs the cases, cheques are issued to the eligible DPs. The photographs of different activities are in **Annexure-11**.

#### **3.4 LARP's Addendum**

42. In addition to the land already acquired for the project, PIU has been acquired 15.4 kanal (1.925 acres) of additional private land for slope stabilization at the dam's right side abutement in Mouza Bela Sacha. For this purpose, the LARP's addendum under section-1 and 2 to document the additional land in mouza Bela Sacha, additional compensation for the positive differential between the replacement cost determined by the IVS and additional/ missing claims for admissible allowances of eligible DPs. Both sectional LARP's addendums have been approved by ADB on August 13, 2024 and uploaded on ADB's and PEDO websites.

43. As per approved Addendum of 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Ghanool and Sangar, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1152 under IVS compensation

amount is PKR 13.90 million of the same acquiring land. Additionally, 21 DPs are eligible for different admissible allowances against the payable amount of PKR 3.78 million. Similarly, as per approved Addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,494 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 272.46 million of the same acquiring land. However, an additional land of 15.4 kanal owned by 91 DPs and compensation amount is PKR 0.0922 million. Similarly, other LAR-related impacts included the following: (i) 380 wood trees owned by 91 DPs amounting PKR 0.7705 and 7 fruit trees owned by 1 DPs amounting PKR 0.162 million; and (ii) 5 structures owned by 1 DP amounting PKR 11.061 million. Consequently, 285 DPs under different additional/ missing admissible allowances amounting PKR 128.43 million.

## **4 LARP IMPLEMENTATION PROGRESS REVIEW**

### **4.1 LARP Implementation Progress in Reporting Period**

44. As per approved LARPs and its addendums, the compensation and admissible allowances for land and above land assets awarded under LAA 1894 was deposited in the district treasury at the disposal of LAC assigned by the Land Revenue Department in the District Mansehra for completing land acquisition process and disbursement of awarded compensation and allowances. Disbursement of land and non-land compensation awarded under the law commenced on August 2, 2022 for 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP, on August 23, 2022 for 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP and on December 26, 2024 for addendum to LARP by the LAC in the district revenue department. Similarly, all the admissible allowances mentioned below were also paid by LAC/ PIU supported by PMC. The field staff of PIU and PMC thoroughly supported the revenue department staff to expedite the disbursement of compensation and allowances to the DPs. As per procedure, DPs visited the ADC Mansehra revenue office to receive compensation. The concerned Tehsildar prepared voucher for the DPs for all their due compensation for affected land and non-land assets from the respective acquaintance rolls. The same voucher was forwarded to the DC office for signing and approval. After signing, the voucher was handed over to the DPs for submission in the district account office. The district account office then prepared a cheque on account of respective DPs. Similarly, DPs then directly submitted their cheques in their respective bank accounts for onward clearance/receiving the desired amount. Payment voucher in **Annexure-3**. The field data of the unpaid DPs of all mouzas under sections-1 and 2 are collected by PIU/ PMC field staff and prepared all the requisite legal and administrative impediments of unpaid DPs.

### **4.2 Section and Mouza wise LARP's Implementation and Handing over of Sites**

45. The PIU, in consultation with ADB project team, adopted section and mouza wise LARP implementation approach to facilitate handing over of sections/ mouza for construction where implementation of LARP is completed and validated by the External Monitor in parallel with implementation of LARP in other sections/ mouza. Accordingly, resources were focused to complete disbursement of compensation and document all unpaid DPs having impediments to confirm implementation of LARP. All four mouzas under sections-1 and 2 have been cleared and handed over to the contractor on validation of EMA. Under 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> EMRs for mouza Ghanool and Sangar (separately) were approved by ADB on December 23, 2022 and December 27, 2022 respectively. Under 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP, the 3<sup>rd</sup> EMR for mouza Bela Sacha and Paras was approved by ADB on March 7, 2023. The latest EMR for July to December 2024 was approved by ADB on June 9, 2025.

46. The PIU and PMC staff during reporting period (July-December 2025), continued exhaustive efforts through all sources to inform and mobilize all the unpaid DPs in the affected mouzas/ villages to get their compensation and allowances for their acquired land and affected trees, and resolve their issues related to land or non-land. The overall detail of disbursement of compensation and allowances of each sectional LARPs during the reporting period are presented as under.

### **4.3 Overall Summary of LARP Implementation in all Sections and Mouzas**

47. Under the land award of section-11 of LAA 1894, acquaintance roll (DPs land/ trees/ built-up property compensation payment book) has been prepared for the entire affected land and non-land assets of each mouzas separately under sections-1 & 2 by the LAC of land revenue department of district Mansehra. According to "land award", a total of 1811.35 kanal (226.419 acres) of land (including 492.72 kanal (61.59 acres) communal land. The revenue department of Mansehra District is working on the assessment/ compilation of communal land DPs and once it is completed, then the detail will be incorporated in the upcoming report. As per approved LARP under section 1, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,791 to 1,874 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, owners of trees also increased from original number (1,773 to 1,862 DPs). Nonetheless, the amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. As per approved LARP under section 2, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (1,766 to 1,821 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, owners of trees also increased from original number (1,575 to 1,647 DPs). Nonetheless, the amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. All the "awarded amount" compensation of land, trees, built-up property and all the requisite amount for admissible allowances has been deposited in the district treasury department of District Mansehra by PEDO. The tables 4.1 and 4.2 indicate that during the reporting period from July-December 2025, PKR 410.6 million (72.33%) of total amount of land compensation payable PKR 567.69 million has been disbursed to 1,947 (52.69 %) out of total 3,695 DPs for acquired land of 1118.96 kanal (139.87 acres) (61.77%) out of total 1,811.35 kanal (226.42 acres) in all four mouzas under sections-1 & 2. Similarly, 1,449 (41.3%) out of total 3,509 DPs of trees affected received PKR 72.25 (88.32%) out of total PKR 81.81 million of trees compensation. However, total number of land DPs has changed from the original number (3,557 to 3,695 DPs) due to inheritance mutation. Similarly, owners of trees also increased from original number (3,348 to 3,509 DPs) in all four villages of BHPP. Nonetheless, the amount of payable compensation remains unchanged. Moreover, affected built-up property compensation paid to 438 DPs (100%) out of total 438 DPs with PKR 1395.838 (93.12%) out of total PKR 1498.999 million in entire affected mouzas of BHPP. Additionally, based on their income analysis/ investigation there is no new DP eligible for vulnerability allowance among the additional DPs due to inheritance mutation. For comparative analysis, section and mouza wise summary of compensation, disbursement for LAR impacts (land, trees and built-up property), and progress of payments achieved during reporting period (July-December 2025) are presented in **Table 4.1**, **Table 4.2**, **Table 4.3** and **Table 4.4**.

#### **4.3.1 Disbursement of Trees Compensation**

48. In the reporting period (July-December 2025), PKR 72.25 million of total PKR 81.81 million compensation amount of fruit and non-fruit trees has been disbursed to 1,449 of total 3,509 DPs (41.3%) in entire four mouzas of the Project. However, owners of trees increased from original number (3,182 to 3,338 DPs of timber trees) and (166 to 171 DPs of fruit trees) due to inheritance mutation. The slow progress of tree compensation amount disbursement is due to non-availability of the DPs to receive the tree compensation amount. The undisbursed compensation amount is secured in the district treasury account to ensure payment as and when the DPs will show up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues. The section and mouza wise detail of awarded fruit and non-fruit trees compensation amount, number of DPs, progress of disbursement and its percentage are presented in **Table 4.3**.

#### 4.3.2 Disbursement of Built-up Property Compensation

49. During the reporting period (July-December 2025), PKR 1,395.84 million of total PKR 1,498.99 million (93.12%) compensation amount of built-up property has been disbursed to 100% of total 438 DPs in entire mouzas of BHPP. All DPs of built-up property have been paid, and only communal and public built-up property amount is undisbursed. The undisbursed compensation amount of communal private and public built-up property is secured in the district treasury account to ensure payment as and when unpaid DPs/public department will show up with valid claim documents after completing the required documentation. As per LARPs, total of 197 graves (19 in mouza Sangar, and 178 graves in mouza Paras) are affected due to the project. The PIU has transferred all the requisite amount regarding graves management to the district treasury of district Mansehra. During the reporting period, under the DC Mansehra, already formed a committee for shifting of graves of the affected communities, the contract has been awarded to the selected contractor for shifting of graves

of both mouzas and the contractor working on the graves shifting from the Mouza of Sangar which was completed and soon will complete the process of shifting of graves in Mouza Paras. Similarly, as per award notification under section-11 of LAA 1894 and physical verification by PIU and PMC, no other Masjid exists in the mouza of Sangar. The section and mouza wise category of built-up properties awarded compensation amount, number of DPs, progress of disbursement and its percentage are presented in Table 4.4.

#### 4.3.2.1 Restoration of Built-up Property

50. According to the DPs of affected built-up property, they will restore/reconstruct by their own choice or in another parcel of their own land through the received compensation amount along with other admissible allowances of their affected structures, and also reuse the affected structure salvaged building materials. Furthermore, the project has impact on the built-up properties (public and community structures). However, the negotiation of PIU continued with the respective government departments and district administration of Mansehra and local community for the relocation of the structures.

#### 4.3.3 Pending Payment of Land Compensation

51. The findings of the LARP SASMR (internal) revealed that left-over land payments are impeded due to the following legal and administrative impediments. The required additional documents are recorded following templates provided in the ADB's guidance note on handling of compensation cases having legal and administrative impediments in **Annexure-1**. The staff

of PIU/PMC also continue to inform the unpaid DPs through their relatives and Patwaris to come forward and receive their compensation soonest. These efforts of PIU and PMC are in accordance with ADB's guidance note. In the previous reporting period (January-June 2025), total of 1,757 unpaid DPs of land compensation were pended/ impeded, while during the current reporting quarter (July-December 2025), the unpaid number of DPs decreased to 1,748 of land compensation are impeded due to various reasons. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land and non-land is already deposited and secured in district treasury for payment to the unpaid DPs having legal/ administrative impediments as and when they will show up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/impediments. The additional documents were recorded for unpaid DPs having impediments in all four mouzas of the project. Sample copies of impeded cases are in **Annexure-2**.

- **Stay order by civil court:** The landowners/DPs (43 DPs having PKR 4.21 million amounts identified so far) filed their reference and title disputes in the courts which have not been resolved. The compensation amount could not be paid to them until land compensation and title issues are resolved/decided by the competent revenue authorities/courts. Summary of unpaid litigating number of DPs in each mouza under sections-1 and 2 is presented in **Table 4.5**.
- **DPs working abroad:** As per LAA 1894, DPs have to submit their claims supported with valid title documents, and receive compensation voucher/cheque in person after due verification of their documents and records. The staff of PIU regularly contacted their relatives to advise the DPs to get the compensation, or issue a valid power of attorney to collect the awarded compensation amount on behalf of the unpaid DP. Currently, a total of 50 DPs (no co-owner existed) having land compensation amount PKR 5.50 million are identified as working abroad. These DPs will be paid either if they show up personally or provide a valid power of attorney. The unpaid number of DPs of each affected mouza living/working abroad is in **Table 4.5**.
- **Inheritance mutation issues:** The landowners (172 DPs amounting PKR 16.20 million so far identified) who passed away require mutation of land to the legal heirs. Payments of compensation to legal heirs will be made after mutation of land is affected by the district revenue authority. For this purpose, PIU staff thoroughly support the revenue staff and mobilize known legal heirs to speed up the mutation process for DPs. After the inheritance mutation is reflected in the land record, all heirs of deceased DPs will receive entitled compensation as per their inherited share. However, the cases of DPs with pending mutations have been documented for all mouzas of project following ADB's guidance note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments in **Annexure-1**. The number of DPs with inheritance mutation in each mouza is presented in **Table 4.5**.
- **Awarded meager<sup>7</sup> compensation amount:** A total of 1,025 unpaid DPs are entitled to awarded compensation amount less than PKR 5,000. Total sum of meager compensation amount is PKR 0.94 million that have not yet been disbursed because

<sup>7</sup> Compensation amounts up to PKR 5000 is defined as meager amount. It is likely that most of the DPs in this category may lack interest in claiming compensation following prevalent payment mode under LAA 1894.

DPs are not inclined to get valid title documents and submit claims. As procedural requirement, DPs have to get the land title documents from land record office, open bank accounts, and appear in person before the LAC and District Accounts Office for verification and to receive compensation vouchers and cheques. No mechanism is available to make cash compensation to DPs in the revenue department/LAC at district Mansehra. Due to cumbersome procedural requirements for receiving such a small amount of compensation, DPs are reluctant to open bank accounts as the amount required for opening a bank account is much more than the entitled compensation amount. The unpaid meager compensation amount of land, and total number of unpaid DPs of meager amount of each mouza is in **Table 4.5**.

- **Juvenile DPs (under the age of 18):** Currently, a total of 4 DPs having compensation amount PKR 7,429 are juvenile and lack CNIC in all mouzas of the project. Such juvenile DPs can be paid either through their guardian, provided guardianship certificate issued by a competent court is produced or when the juvenile DP gets his CNIC after turning 18 years old. Accordingly, statements of natural guardians will be documented in accordance with the template in ADB's guidance note. The unpaid juvenile DPs of each mouza is presented in **Table 4.5**.
- **DPs having communal land:** As per revenue record and LAR implementation, 492.72 kanal of communal land amounting to PKR 67.45 million are unpaid due to communal/joint compensation amount, and not viable to disburse among all the DPs. Under the record of revenue department, the total DPs are not yet identified, and the disbursement of compensation is possible when the exact number of DPs under this category is identified/communicated by the revenue department. Hence, it will take time to disburse as and when all the DPs are identified and are available to receive their due compensation amount from the revenue department. Additionally, the revenue department is working on the separate acquaintance roll for such DPs against communal land, which is not yet finalized. Also, the DPs of communal land having some internal family dispute filed reference/stay order from the civil court against each other. The timeline depends upon the availability of DPs, and resolving their internal family dispute.
- **DPs out of city:** As per available revenue record, 188 DPs identified having land compensation amounting to PKR 53.11 million have migrated/out of city in Pakistan for better work opportunities. Even though they all were informed by their relatives to collect their due compensation amount, they are neither showing up in person nor nominating attorneys to collect compensation on their behalf. Out of city unpaid DPs are documented, and their records are maintained as per ADB's guidance note. A summary of all mouzas are in **Table 4.5**.
- **DPs out of village:** As per revenue record, 266 DPs identified having land compensation amounting to PKR 9.7 million in all affected mouzas of the project, were unknown by their respective mouza inhabitants and revenue staff. Their whereabouts are also unknown. So, these DPs and their current residences are not known. The out of village unpaid DPs of all four mouzas are presented in **Table 4.5**.

#### 4.3.4 Payment of Allowances by LAC/ PIU

52. During the reporting period (July-December 2025), all the admissible allowances have been mostly paid to the entitled DPs of all four mouzas. As per approved LARPs, 286 of total 325 DPs have been paid for their 1,664 of total 1,706 admissible allowances, totaling PKR 523.116 million of total PKR 527.779 million (99.12%). The 39 DPs having 42 unpaid number of allowances amounting to PKR 4.663 million are unpaid due to out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors, and soon will receive their due allowances. All the admissible allowances for entitled DPs are already deposited and secured in the district treasury for payment to the DPs. A sample copy of payment receipt of allowances in **Annexure-3**. All the admissible number of allowances, number of entitled DPs, payable allowances, and progress of disbursement of allowances and its percentage is presented in **Table 4.6**.

#### **4.4 Status of Implementation of Approved LARP Addendums**

53. Under the approved Addendum of 1<sup>st</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Ghanool and Sangar, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,152 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 13.90 million of the same acquiring land. However, no DPs have been paid at the end of reporting period due to extensive meager compensation amount of almost all DPs reflecting lack of interest of DPs for receiving of such meager compensation amount. Although, 9 of total 21 DPs (42.85%) have been paid for all their additional/ missing admissible allowances, amounting PKR 3.34 million of total PKR 3.78 million (88.45%). The 12 unpaid DPs of additional/missing allowances amounting PKR 0.44 million are undisbursed mainly because these DPs are out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors, and soon will receive their due additional/ missing allowances once they return to the village. Table 4.7 shows the progress under the LARP's addendum during reporting period, July-December 2025 are as under.

54. Similarly, under the approved Addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP's comprising Mouza Bela Sacha and Paras, the total number of DPs as per IVS acquaintance roll is 1,494 under IVS compensation amount is PKR 272.46 million of the same acquired land. An amount of PKR 140.51 million (51.57%) of the total payable IVS land compensation amount of PKR 272.46 million has been disbursed to 782 of total 1,494 DPs (52.34%) in mouza Paras only. In addition to this, under the additional land compensation payment an amount PKR 0.0086 million of the total payable compensation amount of PKR 0.0922 to 1 of total 91 DPs in mouza Bela Sacha only (the sluggish disbursement of land compensation amount is due to meager amount of almost all unpaid DPs). Similarly, under the fruit trees compensation paid to 1 DPs of total 1 DPs (100%) received PKR 0.162 million out of total PKR 0.162 million (100%). Moreover, affected built-up property (5 structures) compensation under additional land has been paid to 1 of total 1 DPs with an amount of PKR 11.061 million of total PKR 11.061 million (100%) in the only mouza Bela Sacha under section 2 LARP addendum against the additional land for BHPP. Consequently, under the approved addendum of 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional LARP, 89 of total 285 DPs (31.23%) have been paid for all their additional/ missing admissible allowances amounting PKR 118.65 million (92.4%) of total payable PKR 128.43 million. The 196 unpaid DPs of additional/missing allowances amounting PKR 9.78 million are undisbursed mainly because of DPs are out of village. They were already informed through their relatives and neighbors, and soon will receive their due additional/ missing allowances once they return to the village. The summary progress under the LARP's addendum of previous and during reporting period, July-December 2025 presented under **Table 4.7** and section and mouza wise summary of compensation, disbursement for LAR impacts (land, trees and built-up property), and payment of allowances progress achieved during reporting period (July-December 2025) are presented in below **Table 4.8, Table 4.9, Table 4.10 and Table 4.11**.

55. Furthermore, under the registered complaints (some received directly to the PIU while others received through ADB) regarding business and loss of employment allowances about 20 DPs have been considered based on their submitted documentary proof and thorough field verification in the respective affected village/ mouza of the project. The total amount of such allowances for the 20 DPs are PKR 6.12 million. The process of disbursement will be initiated in the current quarter of 2026 among the respective complainants.

#### 4.5 Section and Mouza (village) wise Hydropower Component and Cleared Acquired Land of BHPP

56. The PIU is committed to complete the implementation process of LARPs in the entire project. Based on the approved LARPs' implementation progress in the reporting period, the PIU confirms that all payable DPs have been fully paid as per LARP provisions, and there is no unpaid DP left without valid legal and administrative impediments. The undisbursed compensation amount for acquired land is already deposited and secured in the district treasury. Payment will be made to the unpaid DPs (47.31%) having legal/administrative impediments as and when they will show up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues/impediments. The mouzas (villages) under sections-1 & 2 presented in gray, green, blue and orange colors have been handed over to the contractor upon the EMA's validation of LARP implementation in 1<sup>st</sup> (December 23, 2022)<sup>8</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> (December 27, 2022)<sup>9</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> (March 7, 2023)<sup>10</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> (June 9, 2025)<sup>11</sup> EMRs approved by ADB. Additionally, under the LARPs addendums approved by ADB in terms of IVS compensation payment is under progress simultaneously towards the commencement of civil works and full implementation of LARP. The LARP implementation status is presented at a glance in **Table 4.12**.

**57. Issuance of public notices:** Following the land award in 2022, PIU and the District Administration/ Revenue Office issued five notices to all APs on the following dates: January 2024, February 2024, May 2024, Sept 2024 and May 2025 but not all APs evacuated/ demolished their structures. This continues causing delays in construction work and affecting the construction plan prepared keeping in view the river low flow seasons. However, through this protocol and the notices already issued and disseminated in the affected villages/ mouzas during the reported period. Similarly, all APs are bound to vacate/ demolish the structure within 15 days (or before if possible) from the date of issuance of the final notice. The notices has been delivered to all APs (structure owner/ user) through the Revenue Officials (Patwaris) personally and a copy of the notices fixed/ pasted on the main gate/ boundary wall of the affected structure. The process of issuance of notices, payment of compensation and evacuation/ demolition of structures may also be validated by the external monitoring consultant of PIU.

58. Furthermore, the PIU confirms that unpaid compensation is secured in the district treasury, and unpaid DPs having legal/administrative impediments have been fully informed about processing and payment of their claims as and when they show up. However, all exhaustive efforts on part of the PIU and PMC will be continued till the completion of LARP implementation. Therefore, the SASMR (internal) for July-December 2024 reports full implementation of LARP<sup>12</sup> is confirmed and validated by the EMA through his 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> EMRs of entire BHPP.

## **5 LARP IMPLEMENTATION MONITORING SET-UP**

### **5.1 LARP Implementation Monitoring**

60. Implementation and monitoring of LARP consistent with the project loan covenants and ADB's SPS 2009 are the key requirement to hand over the sites to the contractor and proceed with physical works. Therefore, for smooth and efficient implementation of LARPs, safeguards management is set up at the PIU, as the focal unit for LARP implementation, to (i) maintain updated LARP data about DPs with respect to compensation, entitlements and payment record; (ii) facilitate consultations with stakeholders, including DPs, project executors, and district land revenue authorities; (iii) track and monitor day-to-day implementation progress, and prepare periodic monitoring reports; and (iv) maintain a log of complaints received and redressed, and facilitate project GRCs to review and resolve the complaints.

61. Similarly, LARP implementation is also monitored externally through an EMA by PIU. The objective of resettlement monitoring is to validate implementation of LARPs, payment of compensation to DPs, and livelihood restoration support; and ensure safeguards monitoring compliance during implementation as per ADB's SPS 2009.

### **5.2 Exhaustive Efforts**

62. Since the start of LARP implementation on August 2, 2022, the PIU of BHPP, through its safeguard's management set-up, is closely coordinating with the LAC and district land revenue offices to facilitate timely completion of land acquisition, processing and payment of compensation to the DPs, and ensure full implementation of LARPs before handing over of the sites to the contractor. Meanwhile, the safeguards team, headed by the Deputy Director Social and Resettlement, maintained close liaison with the affected persons and local communities in the project-affected villages to disclose LARP-related information, and facilitate DPs in accessing requisite valid claim documents (i.e. getting their land title documents from land revenue offices and CNIC, opening bank accounts, and processing and payment of compensation). With coordinated efforts, the land and non-land compensation has reached to a reasonably good percentage in all the four mouzas of the BHPP by the LAC's office of District Mansehra.

63. No doubt, LARP implementation is a long, time-consuming and challenging process, yet all possible exhaustive efforts to expedite the process has been taken by the concerned project staff. Based on the compensation payment progress explained in previous sections, it is perceived and confirmed that all payable DPs have been compensated for their acquired land and assets. The remaining unpaid DPs are those who have valid legal/administrative impediments. All such DPs have been approached and informed that the compensation amount has been secured in the district treasury account for payment to them as and when they will show up with valid claim documents after resolving their issues. The PIU and PMC staff monitor the progress of paid and unpaid DPs as mentioned in the respective acquaintance roll at the revenue department, and collect and use the data for monitoring purposes for each affected area. In addition, following ADB's guidance note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments in **Annexure-1**, all accessible DPs were approached and additional documents as needed have been recorded and

maintained during the monitoring period by the safeguards team of PIU and PMC. The efforts by the PIU safeguards team for information dissemination and ensuring participation of affected communities and line government departments for smooth implementation of LARPs are summarized in the sub-sections below.

### 5.3 Community Consultations/Meetings

64. To expedite the LARP implementation process, PIU staff, including Deputy Director Social and Resettlement, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender, and Assistant Director Social and Resettlement, along with PMC staff regularly conducted consultation meetings (photographs annexed) with male and female DPs of each affected mouza of the project. During the reporting period, 35 meetings have been conducted, in which 264 male and 98 female DPs raised all their queries/concerns regarding compensation and allowances for their affected assets. Accordingly, they were all informed to receive their due compensation and allowance amount from the revenue department. Similarly, there was wide publicity through print and electronic media, announcements in local mosques (masjids), banners, and LARP information brochures distributed among the meeting participants as well as in the affected mouzas of the project. Below table 5.1 shows the number of meetings along with participants in each section/mouza under BHPP.

#### 5.4 Coordination Meetings with District Revenue Officials

66. The DC Mansehra office has been regularly contacted during the reporting period for the required information and documentation. These include the disbursement of land and non-land compensation; payment of meager compensation amount; and all other issues related to DPs, including inheritance mutation, and IVS positive differential compensation, payment of compensation of additional land acquisition, shifting of graves and other public structures and all admissible allowances payment. A summary of meetings conducted with DC Mansehra and other district administration officials is given in **Table 5.3** below.

## 5.5 Dissemination of LARP related Information<sup>13</sup>

67. In order to expedite the LARP implementation process, PIU, supported by PMC, disseminated LARP-related information to all concerned DPs which included but not limited to installation of 6 banners in public offices, such as AC/Tehsildar's offices and service delivery center in Balakot and other public places like Masjids and Jamia Masjids of affected mouzas in the project area. During the exhaustive efforts, the PIU produced information related to LARP implementation through print media i.e. local and national newspapers for public awareness to receive their compensation. Various posters and flip charts have been displayed showing salient features of BHPP. The safeguards team of PIU and PMC disseminated the LARP information brochure through community consultation meetings, and interaction with DPs at revenue department and other prominent places in each mouza. Awareness among the DPs regarding LARPs compensation has been created through social media link available in **Annexure-7**. The PIU staff along with the revenue department staff are frequently visiting the mouzas under sections-1 and 2 for the purpose of disbursements of compensation and allowances.

## **6 PROJECT IMPACT ON WOMEN MOBILITY AND PRIVACY**

68. During LAR implementation stage in the reporting period, there is no major impact recorded regarding women mobility and privacy in the project area due to project activities. The major activity is the information dissemination and facilitation by PIU/PMC social safeguard team to disseminate the LARP information among the affected households and communities in the affected mouzas of the project. They were also informed regarding opening of bank accounts, and preparing valid CNIC for receiving compensation amount smoothly against their affected land and non-land assets. The PIU, Deputy Director Health, Safety, Environment and Gender, and Assistant Director Social and Resettlement, along with PMC staff, regularly conducted the consultation meetings with female DPs of affected mouzas of the project. During the reporting period, multiple meetings have been conducted with 98 female DPs to address all their queries/concerns regarding compensation and allowances of their affected assets. The women were also informed of their male household members to receive due compensation amount from the revenue department. The gender action plan (GAP) is being implemented in accordance with its terms under each output in the project's design and monitoring framework. Under the LARP's implementation, the compensation and allowances have been provided to the eligible female DPs. The other outputs of GAP are linked with LRP implementation through the consultant NGO. All such activities of GAP will be implemented during implementation of LRP by the consultant NGO. The consultant NGO has been mobilized since September 7, 2023 in the project area.

69. During the reporting period, there is no major impact recorded regarding gender issues, particularly regarding women in disbursing compensation and allowances. The LARP also identified the female DPs in terms of the loss of their assets. Like the male DPs, the women are also receiving their payments. The PIU and PMC are thoroughly facilitating in resolving issues related to compensation/allowances payment at the district revenue office. The field staff are regularly conducting consultation meetings with the female DPs to keep them updated about the project and their compensation payments, and addressing any issues during disbursement. Attendance sheets of the consultations are attached in **Annexure-4**.

## 7 LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT INTERVENTION MEASURE

### 7.1 Employment Opportunities

70. Under output 4 of the project's design and monitoring framework: income-earning opportunities and skills for local communities increased, relevant training facilitation support under the LRP through the consultant NGO will be provided to the DPs. Training on agriculture production, livestock rearing, beekeeping, fish farming, and linkages with microfinance institutions will be provided as per the local requirements, particularly for unemployed youth, both men and women, for relevant skills improvement/capacity building to reduce impacts on their livelihood. The consultant NGO has been mobilized since September 7, 2023 in the affected project areas. The consultant NGO implementing the LRP which has been approved by ADB on April 24, 2025.

71. Furthermore, as per LRP, it is planned that a livelihood skills development center for women will be established to cater short and long-term employment opportunities to the local affected person/ DPs. The center will be established by the consultant NGO as per their approved terms of reference. The timeline for establishing the skills development center will be finalized by the consultant NGO.

### 7.2 Short-Term Project-Based Employment

72. The LARP provided for employment of local laborers and members of DPs. PIU has been following up with the contractor and PMC in providing job opportunities to the locals. The information regarding employment opportunities were disseminated through consultation meetings with DPs, brochures, and through GRC members of each mouza. As per the contractor record, the contractor, consultants, PIU and consultant-NGO have employed a total of 2,643 persons for short-term employment (skilled and un-skilled labor), of which 1,692 (64.02%) are locals, including 856 DPs employed from the affected mouzas of the project. Hiring of skilled and unskilled labor from the project area is monitored by the PIU through the monthly progress reports of the contractor. The list of skilled and un-skilled employees is in **Annexure-10**. And the summary of skilled and un-skilled laborers working in the project sites in below **Table 7.1**.

### 7.3 Compliance with Core Labour Standards

73. The PIU is conscious of the national labour laws, core labour standards (CLS) and health, safety and environment requirements to be followed by the contractors. Accordingly, the relevant provisions and requirement to be followed for avoiding forced labor, child labour,

and discrimination at work including health, safety and security of the labour were adequately implanted in the bidding and contract documents. The employment process being followed and record maintained by the contractors is reviewed as well as the contractor's camps and work sites are regularly monitored to ensure the core labour standards and outlined health, safety and environmental requirements are fully complied. Based on the reviewed record and on-site verifications, it is understood that the contractors are well aware with the contractual requirements and they are generally complying the CLS requirements. So, during monitoring period no instance of forced or child labour and/or discrimination at work site was reported.

## 8 GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISM AND COMPLAINTS HANDLING

74. The GRM aims to mediate conflicts, and respond to complaints related to environment and social safeguard (LARP) performance of the project. The project's Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) is fully operational. The village level Grievance Redress Committees (GRCs) for Ghanool and Sangar were established on 15 September 2022 under sectional LARP 1, whereas GRCs for Bela Sacha and Paras were established under sectional LARP 2 on 26 September 2022 and on 12 January 2023, respectively. Additionally, a female Grievance Redress Committees (GRC) also have been formed by PIU for the resolution of female concern related to Project. The GRC notifications are in **Annexure-9**.

75. A complaint register is maintained at site with the contractor as well as in the office of the Project Director (PIU). The placing of the complaint register at the contractor's camp is well publicized. Detailed GRM is affixed on the sign board installed at the Chief Engineer's office to guide complainants. The office of the Chief Engineer of the PMC is the first level to register and resolve the complaint if it is not addressed by the contractor. The Chief Engineer will deliver his decision within one week of registration of the case. If no understanding or amicable solution can be reached, or if the affected person does not receive a response from the Chief Engineer' offices within one week of the registry of the complaint, the affected person can appeal to the GRC in writing to the office of the Project Director PIU-BHPP. The GRC at the PIU level will address the complaint on priority, and is fully responsible to resolve the complaint.

76. **Applications/ Concerns/ Demands of DPs Submitted to PIU/ GRC:** Since inception, a total of 61 applications/ concerns/demands registered under GRC which were received by PIU from the affected communities. Out of total 59 applications/ concern/ demands , i.e., 2 applications regarding pending labor wages, 27 concerns/ apprehension related to additional/missing allowances, 10 applications related to internal family disputes on LARP's allowances, 4 concern regarding partial assessment of built-up property, 6 concern about demanding of business allowances, 3 applications regarding objection on the GRC members of village Paras GRC and 1 application related to damage of material mixture machine by local administration have been resolved amicably with the complainant's consensus and 4 applications/ concerns/ demands have been registered through GRC and 4 applications/

concerns received from ADB through email to PIU. During the reporting period, total 2 complaints/ applications/ demands received by PIU, which have been resolved and closed by the village level GRC and they were informed about the decision accordingly. The summary of applications/ complaints tabulated under **Table 8.1 & 8.2**.

**77. Complaints of DPs Submitted to ADB's Accountability Mechanism: Office of Special Facilitator (OSPF) and Compliance Review Panel (CRP):** Before implementation of LARP-1, OSPF received one complaint in June 2022 from the village which was related to land acquisition, valuation and compensation. However, CRP received two complaints in January 2024 regarding missing business allowance from village Bela Sacha. Parallel commencement of LARP's implementation, PIU completed an IVS that determined a differential in the awarded prices and IVS rates. The IVS differential has been approved by the provincial government for additional payments to DPs through the addendum LARP's which has been approved by ADB. Similarly, CRP complainant provided additional documents to support his claims of business allowance. Based on the requisite document provided by complainant's, PIU has been accepted the claims for business allowance under the approved LARP's addendum eligibility criteria. Similarly, the complainant's provided a satisfaction certificate to PIU and was annexed at annexure-11 in the previous SASMR (January- June 2024).

78. Furthermore, PIU/ PMC staff conducted additional consultations with members of GRCs on the issue of "Chula allowance". After deliberate discussion/meetings with GRC members by PIU/ PMC and based on provided documentary proof, the finalized and agreed number of eligible DPs for Chulla Allowance from each village was completed i.e., the eligible number of DPs under missing Chulla allowances from village Paras are 45, from village Bela Sacha is 1 DP and from village Sangar is also 1 DP. However, the remaining DPs are mostly eligible for one-time structure relocation and business allowance in all villages. All such DPs along with their claims and provided documents are scrutinized in accordance with the criteria in approved LARP's under section-1 and 2. The detail information of the eligible DPs under missing allowances are available in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> sectional approved LARP's addendum.

## 9 LARP Implementation and Social Safeguards Compliance Plan

79. The commencement of civil works will be subject to the satisfactory implementation of LARP along with its Addendum, including payment of compensation for land, structures, trees and allowances, and redressal of community concerns. LAR implementation should be verified by an independent/ ERM. The updated schedule for the implementation of LARP (milestones) and its associated activities are in **Table 9.1**.

## Annexure-1: Guidance Note on handling compensation cases with legal and administrative impediments of ADB

GUIDANCE NOTES		X	Handling Compensation Cases with Legal and Administrative Impediments
<b>Policy Requirement</b>			Pay compensation and provide other resettlement entitlements before physical or economic displacement. <sup>1</sup>
<b>Key Pointers</b>			<p>1. ADB Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS2009) requires the borrower/client to ensure that no physical displacement or economic displacement will occur until (i) compensation at full replacement cost<sup>2</sup> has been paid to each displaced person (DP) for project components or sections that are ready to be constructed; (ii) other entitlements listed in the resettlement plan have been provided to DPs; and (iii) a comprehensive income and livelihood rehabilitation program, supported by an adequate budget, is in place to help DPs improve, or at least restore, their incomes and livelihoods. While compensation is required to be paid before displacement, full implementation of the LARP might take longer.<sup>3</sup> To ensure policy compliance, specific provisions are included in the Project/Loan agreements to keep on-hold civil works until compensation payments are fully paid to the DPs.</p> <p>2. Compensation for both land and non-land assets is deemed to have been paid when the amount in cash or cheque has been provided to DPs<sup>4</sup> or deposited into their bank account, or in an escrow account.<sup>5</sup> Depositing the compensation in an escrow account, in lieu of providing cash or cheque to the DP is justified only when sufficient good-faith efforts and all legal requirements for contacting and notifying the DPs have been made.</p> <p>3. Pakistan's Land Acquisition Act (1894) allows the government to take possession of the acquired land once land award has been made as per LAA Section 11, and payment has been made or deposited in court as per LAA Section 31. Accordingly, the Collector is required to pay the full amount to the DP, unless (a) the DP refuses to receive the amount, (b) there is no competent person to receive the compensation, or (c) if there is a dispute as to the title to receive the compensation. Such cases may be referred to the court and the compensation amount deposited in the court.<sup>6</sup> In case the DPs or their representatives did not come forward to collect their compensation, the</p>

DPs who did not accept the award due to objection to the measurement of the land or affected asset, the amount of compensation, the person to whom it is payable, or the apportionment of the compensation among the persons interested;</li> <li>ii. Absentee landowners (DPs living overseas or in other parts of the country), and without an authorized representative to collect compensation;</li> <li>iii. DPs with pending inheritance mutations;</li> <li>iv. DPs who are unenthusiastic to collect meager compensation amount;</li> <li>v. DPs who are unable to alienate the acquired asset either by being a juvenile with no legally documented guardian or due to other issues.</li> </ul>
<p><i>Cases not valid as legal and administrative impediments</i></p>	<p>6. Non-disbursement/non-delivery of compensation due to (a) insufficient funds or delay in approval of funds; or (b) insufficient staff or resources does not justify not paying compensation to DPs before displacement. EAs/IAs have the power and responsibility to ensure that sufficient funds and staffing are available in a timely manner to undertake the required land acquisition. Similarly, non-compensation of affected non-land assets (structures) and improvements by DPs who have no formal rights to the affected land is not considered as a valid legal and administrative impediment (see footnote 4).</p>
<p><i>Why is it important to address cases with legal and administrative impediments?</i></p>	<p>7. DPs facing legal and administrative impediments could only be paid when the impediments have been resolved. In such cases, it is uncertain when DPs will receive their compensation causing untoward delay in project implementation and burden to local communities and project stakeholders. More importantly, these impediments prevent the project from assisting these DPs to enhance, or at least restore, their livelihoods and to improve the standards of living of the displaced poor and other vulnerable groups.</p>
<p><i>Good-faith efforts for cases with</i></p>	<p>8. Compensation of these DPs is beyond the control of the EA. These are mainly dependent of the actions of the DPs or ruling/decision from a third-party i.e. the court or BOR. However, good-faith efforts are needed from the EA/IA to (a) contact and notify DPs through their last known address, village heads or kins; (b) inform DPs who to</p>

Documentation of the efforts by the LAR management team including multiple visits<sup>9</sup> to DPs' villages, organizing village meetings, posting of notices in public places, serving notices at last known address of DPs and publishing the names of unpaid DPs in the print media is needed to demonstrate that due efforts were conducted in addressing cases with impediments to paying compensation.</p>
<i>Cases with title disputes and litigation</i>	<p>10. Some issue-specific measures to confirm DPs' understanding about the availability of compensation, payment mechanism, time-lines, and DPs' agreement to the commencement of works (wherever required) while the issue is being resolved can help show and validate the efforts exhausted by the EA to achieve the policy objectives and enable the decision makers to allow the construction works accordingly. For each issue, documentation requirements and recording of certification statements are discussed below. Standard templates for additional documentation are provided against each issue as and wherever required:</p>

**i) Land Title Disputes or Litigations among the DPs or Court References Against Award**

11. When there is a dispute on the title of the affected land before a competent court of law or when DPs file references against award, compensation can only be made after the court decrees which may take years. Further, right to appeal against court's decree cannot be forfeited or denied under law which could further delay the payment. In such cases, payment of compensation in a given time frame is impossible and it would be appropriate to deposit compensation in treasury at courts disposal to make sure the DPs are paid as and when court verdict is passed. For these cases, the process provided in the succeeding paras should be followed.

12. Immediately after identifying such cases, the EA after seeking court's permission should deposit the compensation amount in the court for payment to the DPs as and when court decides their reference or title dispute. The receipt and records for such deposits should be maintained at the EA's project office. Meanwhile, the EA through its LAR staff should liaise with the DPs to inform them about the compensation payment mechanism and compensation deposited in the treasury or the court. The EA's project office should prepare and maintain the following record:

- Database/listing and field reports on activities done to identify and screen DPs with their legal/administrative issues including nature of dispute and reference court where pending
- Field reports on activities done to coordinate with the DPs for early resolution of

Many rural households migrate to cities for better livelihood opportunities and standard of living. Moreover, hereditary division over time resulted in the segmentation of agricultural land parcels into unproductive units. While some families with land and assets in different parts of the country divide their land based on their places of residence, many do so without legally formalizing such settlements and getting land records updated accordingly. Some family members who have migrated overseas permanently had land in their name or retained their respective share in family-owned land as per land revenue records. Such DPs who own or have share in the land as per record but are not living in the village are termed as absentee landowners.</p> <p>14. Absentee landowners<sup>10</sup> are also recorded as DPs. The compensation to absentee land owners could not be made until they appear before the acquiring officer for processing and payment of compensation. LAA requires that notices are delivered against each land parcel either through (a) co-sharers in the acquired land parcel, (b) DPs relatives living in the village, or (c) through the village headman. The legal requirement is to serve notices to DPs at their places of residence either through special messenger or registered post, which can only be met if the whereabouts and residence of the absentee land owners is known. An additional measure that may be considered to notify absentee land owners whose whereabouts are unknown is to publish their names in print media (National Daily News Paper).<sup>11</sup></p> <p>15. It is vital to collect information about the DP's contact details including the mailing and residential address. The following measures are proposed to contact absentee landowners and maintain record of all efforts made by the EA:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify and record DPs relation in affected village or local contact person, collect information about DP's present place of residence. **iii) DPs with Pending Inheritance Mutations**

16. Land records are maintained by the local land revenue authorities who are responsible to enter land mutation transactions as and when reported by the landowners and update land records accordingly. Some heirs of DPs who passed away fail to get inheritance mutations recorded and get land records updated accordingly. On average, land acquisition process is completed almost in two years. During the acquisition or after land awards are announced, some DPs pass away without receiving their entitled

Although the legal heirs of the deceased DP are eligible for compensation, they could not be paid until the inheritance mutation is recorded and remaining land of deceased DP is transferred in their name.</p> <p>17. The law requires heirs of the DP to report to the local land revenue authorities about the demise of the DP and apply for the updating of the land record. Upon receipt of the application, the land revenue authorities undergo a legal process to record the inheritance mutation, update the land record reflecting the names of legal heirs and their respective shares in the land record. When it is done, the compensation can be paid to the legal heirs as per their respective share. This process normally takes three to four months. For cases where inheritance mutations are not timely reported, recording becomes more difficult and can take a longer period to complete.</p> <p>18. When it is determined that the DP has passed away, the LAR management team should approach the legal heirs to apprise them on the process for getting compensation and assist them in approaching land revenue authorities to get their inheritance mutations recorded. The LAR management team should carry-out the following activities to facilitate the mutation of inheritance and early payment of compensation to the heirs and document their efforts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Identify all living legal heirs of the DP, visit the heirs residing in the village and guide them on the process and facilitate in inheritance mutation process;</li><li>• Collect a statement from the legal heirs<sup>12</sup> confirming that their inheritance mutation of land is pending, acknowledging the EA's efforts to assist them, indicating awareness that funds are available for compensation delivery, and concurring that works may commence while their inheritance mutation is being processed.</li><li>• Keep copies of the signed statement in the EA project office files. **iv) DPs Who are Unable to Alienate the Acquired Asset:**

**DPs unable to alienate the land**

19. Minors, juveniles and DPs with mental disability are not capable to alienate the acquired land under law. The law provides that compensation could be paid through legally-designated guardians or managers who can act and alienate the immovable property on behalf of the DP. In cases where the guardians are not designated by the court, the compensation is put on-hold until the minor attains the age of majority and claim compensation.

20. It is common that children inherit their parents' immovable properties, but is kept in possession and used by adult male members of the extended family or kinship group as a joint family asset. It is not a common practice to appoint guardians following the Guardians and Wards Act of 1890. Hence, compensation of DPs with minor age is kept on hold until the DP becomes of legal age unless a valid guardian certificate is produced. Although such cases are not many, it is important to guide the adults who provide care to these DPs to approach the right forum or court for appointing a guardian under law.

21. The LAR management team should carry-out the following activities in dealing with pending guardian's appointment and in documenting its efforts:

- Coordinate with the Living Parent or other grown up members of the household the DP is living with and guide them on the process of appointing a guardian.
- Collect a certification statement from the Living Parent or other grown up member of the household the DP is living with, that i) confirms EA's efforts to notify and guide them and secure funds for compensation payment, ii) states that the appointment of guardian is pending, and iii) concurs to the commencement of civil works on the plot while the guardianship certificate is being processed. Such statement should be witnessed by the village headman and the village DPC chairman or member. See Template 4 below (to be translated to Urdu).

The compensation amount itself proves driving factor for DPs to submit their claims. In cases where small land holdings are in joint ownership with several entitled persons, shares in compensation for each DP become very small (\$100 and below). A good number<sup>13</sup> of DPs fall in this category and they never show-up to collect compensation. The situation is further aggravated when such DPs also face other legal or administrative issues like pending inheritance mutations of acquired land or living overseas and other parts in the country.</p> <p>23. Although the law provides a mechanism that includes cash payment at the village or payment through money order in case of absentee land owners<sup>14</sup>, such is no longer practiced. The only available mode is payment through voucher debit-able to the treasury which requires the DP to travel repeatedly to the district/tehsil headquarter to receive their compensation, making the transportation cost higher than their compensation. This also requires that the DP has or opens a bank account.</p> <p>24. Main points of meeting are as under;

- **Payments of pending land and non-land Compensation amount to DPs:**  
The DC Mansehra discussed in detail the progress of payment compensation amount under original approved LARP as well as additional payment under IVS including payment of meager compensation amount. The chair directed all the concerned staff members to accelerate the payment of compensation process in all affected mouzas/ villages under the project. The revenue department agreed to complete the process of compensation payment and ensure speedy disbursement.
- **To accelerate the process of mutation process**  
The DC, directed the revenue staff upon the pending mutation process of deceased unpaid APs and further directed the officials concerned to facilitate and complete the mutation process in all affected mouzas of the project.
- **To complete the process of shifting of Graves in the Mouza of Paras**  
The DC, also directed the concerned staff to complete the process of shifting of graves in mouza Paras. He further briefed the forum that the process of shifting of graves is ongoing and soon will be completed by the respective contractor.
- **Completion of Payment of Public Built-up Properties and its evacuation**  
The DC, further directed the officials concerned regarding the pending payment of built-up properties (public and communal) to the respective department and communities and complete the required anomalies and procedures under the law and clear all outstanding payment as soon as possible. The DC briefed about the some of the public built-up properties (forest and revenue department) have been evacuated and payment of such built-up properties also completed and rest of the built-up properties will be evacuated and payment will be transferred once the respective department will requested accordingly.
- **Payment of Meager Compensation Amount**  
The DC, Mansehra, informed/ directed all the meeting participants about the payment of meager compensation, that there is no alternate mechanism/ solution available in the law to disburse the meager compensation amount and the only solution is to pay the meager compensation amount to the actual DPs as per legal procedure against their claim or affected assets. The DC further directed the revenue department relevant staff to mobilize all the DPs in each mouzas for receiving compensation and their allowances particularly focus on having meager compensation amount of DPs. The PIU staff ensure that regular support will be provided to the revenue staff to facilitate all DPs in terms of voucher preparation and requisite stationary for documentation.






